Peace be with you!

Jesus greets his disciples
locked in a safe place
afraid of the Jews,
fearful of meeting the same fate
as Jesus.

Were they praying? Or making plans?
Or telling stories of their journeys
with Jesus?

Upon greeting the disciples,
Jesus shows them his wounds,
the consequence of his mission,
the outcome of his witness to God's truth.

Those wounds showed the disciples,
except for one, that he truly had died.

Those wounds were his evidence
of rising from death to life.

No dying, no rising again!

Jesus' wounds invited the disciples
to believe in his living presence.

Then they could begin to remember all that
he had said to them before his death.

The disciples rejoiced in seeing
the teacher they loved,
and he greeted them with his peace again
and told them to share
the gift of forgiveness.

For us, as Peter tells us,
faith keeps us constant in love for Jesus
and it is faith that rejoices in our hearts.

the fearful disciples made bold

devote ourselves as they did
to the teaching of Jesus
and to the communal life of faith
and to the breaking of bread in memory of
Jesus' suffering, dying and rising.

It is time to break out of the locked room
of our fears and share the gifts
of the Spirit of peace and forgiveness.
