Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kings 19

Psalms 85

Romans 9

Matthew 14



God gathered the waters of the sea as a mound; God sets the deep into storage vaults. (Psalm 33)

The Hebrew poetry of the psalms asserts that the power of God controls the seas that were seen as home for chaos and forces of evil
Jesus comes across the waters of the sea of Galilee with power over the dark depths of nature and the powers held in them
Peter when battered by a storm requests from Jesus a part in the power he sees in his master
Peter's faith falters and he begins to sink and his courage fails as well
Peter calls out to Jesus as the one to save him
When we are beset by the storms that sweep across our lives it is faith and courage from the Spirit of God that find refuge in Christ
Jesus was plunged into suffering and death on the cross
We are overwhelmed by our troubles when faith and courage are weak
Yet in Jesus our faith saves us
The Eucharist is our share in Jesus' death and resurrection and in his paschal mystery
we are held up and supported in the midst of the world's woes and the chaos that surrounds us
Do not be afraid!
