WORLD DAY of the SICK Sunday, February 11

"Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the Church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. This prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven" (Letter of James 5:14015).

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at all the Masses at St. Patrick on Sunday, February 11.

Caregivers and families are encouraged to make every effort to bring their ill and elderly to Mass on that day



Please join in prayer for those who will be anointed. It is the long standing belief of the Church that the sick can be healed physically and spiritually through the Celebration of this Sacrament. "Theology today understands anointing as the Sacrament of the Sick; the former condition for its reception, i.e., danger of



death has been replaced by the concept of serious illness.

Consequently, the healing effects of the sacrament now find a new emphasis. The Anointing of the

Sick is prayer of Christ and His Church for the physical and spiritual health of the sick person." (Rite for the Anointing and Pastoral Care of the sick, Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commission, 1973.)

You are invited to be anointed if you are:

- Seriously ill, including the elderly who are becoming weaker, even if no illness is present. The illness may be physical and/or mental.
- Waiting for surgery when a serious condition is the reason for the operation.

If you have any questions, ask Judy or Jerry Bettice (Coordinators of our Ministry to the Sick), 901-327-8068, or Father Val.

The Rite itself encourages all the Baptized "to share in this Ministry of mutual charity with the Body of Christ: by fighting against disease, by love shown to the sick and by celebrating the Sacrament of the Sick" (#33)

In anticipation of this communal anointing, let us continue to pray for our sick; for those who work in the medical field; and for our parish ministers of the sick, who visit the hospitals, nursing homes and the homebound.

Because of federal privacy laws, hospitals may not disclose when a parishioner is admitted. Please call the parish office at 901-527-2542 when you or a member of your family enters or plans to enter a hospital. Anointing of the Sick can be arranged when the person is homebound or in advance of scheduled surgery or

when a person is admitted to the hospital. In addition, arrangements can be made to bring Holy Communion to a person who is unable to come to Mass.

Tuition Assistance Second Collection, January 28

Eight students, from K – 6, were in jeopardy of being suspended this week, and a couple of you have already reached out to help ... Thank you! The other part of the story is that there are several more at



the PRE-K Level, partly because their tuition is much higher, because there is not as much available funding for them. A couple of you have asked about what it would take to sponsor a family for month ... the answer is \$55 per child, for K-6, as the minimum. Most of the families that are in trouble have multiple children. The students and faculty of St. Patrick Catholic School would like to encourage you to give generously to the second collection on January 28. Most of our students are well below the poverty rate and even with the Jubilee Network assistance, they struggle to pay tuition. Some of the teachers and staff have already given from their own pockets as well, but as you know, educators' resources are also limited. Your donation at the second collection will go entirely towards tuition for needy families so that they can continue to attend our Catholic school. The students and teachers at St. Patrick appreciate your generosity.

All faculty, students and their families are being invited to join us here next Sunday, January 28th, at 11am Mass, as we kick off the Catholic Schools Week in the Diocese, and they will be participating in the Liturgy that day. More information will be available on the side table, and the Principal, Mrs. Susan Pittman, and other faculty will be here to meet, greet, and answer questions. There will be an Open House for any potentially interested students/families at the school on Tuesday, January 30th, from 9 – noon, and 4-6 pm.

Jonah 3 Psalm 25 1 Corinthians 7 Mark 1

They left boats and nets behind and followed Jesus

After God had put Jonah through the wringer a few times the prophet finally followed God's instructions as in today's first reading Jonah had tried to control God's mercy to conform to his own biases The prophet could not stand the idea that God could save foreigners The fishermen who left boats and nets to follow Jesus gave him a blank check on their lives How different they were from Jonah who did at last carry out God's intent for the people of Nineveh Imagine the burden of carrying boats and nets along the paths that Jesus took What compelled the first disciples to follow this wandering preacher For us the question is What leads us to follow Jesus We need to look to the things we might carry that have to be left behind and see what prejudgments are getting free rent in our minds and preventing us from fulfilling our mission with Jesus and his Spirit in the lead In reenacting the paschal mystery in the Eucharist we are challenged to leave all behind that keeps us

from walking all the way in Jesus' path


