The Good News

PROMISES

Today's liturgy is full of promises. The reading from Genesis promises a final triumph over the power of sin and a return to a new creation. The reading from Second Corinthians promises that all who follow Christ will have to struggle. It also promises, however, that we can persevere if we but recognize that Christ is within us, renewing us daily, and giving us the courage and the strength we need to endure. The Gospel promises that doing God's will makes us "family" with Jesus, who forgives all sin and triumphs over evil.

Today might be a good day for us to make some promises as well. We can promise to stop kidding ourselves about our own tendencies to selfishness and sin. We can promise ourselves to believe—really believe that while we are not sinless, we are forgiven. We can promise ourselves to combat evil and sin by acting as sisters and brothers not only to the Lord, but to one another as well. We can promise ourselves each day that we will give Christ our bodies to live with us, in us, and through us.



<u>A letter of reflection about Fr. Tim</u>

From: John Mayo Sent: Monday, March 26, 2018 Subject: Thank You !!!

First and foremost I give thanks to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ . I can remember growing up there around St. Patrick's during the sixties, I can remember the sound of children playing and doing things that children do . I remember playing hours of basketball right there in in the churchvard; that is where I learned how to play basketball. I can remember chartered buses that took us to the Fairgrounds for swimming; that is where I learned how to swim with the help of peer pressure. I can remember trips to Camp Marymount, trips to Pick Wick Dam, Millington Naval Air Station , and a trip to Mammoth Caves , Ky. I can remember the Fox family in particular, and how kind and involved they were with us and how we played with their children . I can remember Fr. Timothy Tighe, he was my coach at Fr. Bertrand before they closed it down. I also attended Memphis Catholic High School, in fact after my sophomore year there I left and joined the Army.

I was only sixteen at the time , when Fr. Tighe found out he took the time out his schedule to come to Ft. Campbell and visit me to see why I had joined the military. He was fully prepared to bring me back and help me get work so that I could continue basketball and my education . I realized then that I was cared for but I was just one those people that was destined to leave Memphis .

Finally I would like to say that I am very thankful for St Patrick's I can't talk about growing up nor home without mentioning St Patrick's Church. I am so thankful because I left home knowing that not all whites hoarded hatred in their hearts for me simply because my skin was black ,that made it easy for me deal with all kinds of people from all kinds of diverse backgrounds . I have been told that there are a couple of guys working there on Sundays that I grew up with back then one going by the nickname Sleepy and I can't remember the other name . I plan to be in Memphis on Easter Sunday and I plan to attend possibly both masses . I would love to meet the current clergy and more than anything else I would love to know the whereabouts of Fr. Tighe and any members of the Fox family if they are still in attendance there especially .

By the way my name is John Mayo I currently live in Savannah Ga. I retired after twenty three years of military service and I just recently retired from the Post Office after twenty one years. Thanks Again for the many things that I got to do that I wouldn't have if I didn't have relationships with St Patrick's Church while I was growing up, You did make a difference in my life .

Cantors for 8:30!


