

Commemoration of
Hiroshima and Nagasaki
August 6 and 9
Sponsored by Pax Christi Memphis



Sunflowers are the *symbol of a world free of nuclear weapons.* In view of the upcoming anniversaries of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki a

presentation of sunflowers or sunflower images in church reminds us of our role in freeing the world of nuclear weapons.

Paper cranes: ancient Japanese tradition holds that one who folds a thousand paper cranes will receive what one wishes for. Today, cranes signify our determination to eliminate nuclear weapons.

Black ribbons, worn as arm bands, denote mourning and grief--appropriate sentiments in view of the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945.

Fasting for Peace

In the days between August 6 and 9, members of Pax Christi Memphis will be fasting and praying for the abolition of nuclear weapons. Each person will fast and pray on a single day in that time period.



Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I recently had the great privilege of forming a team to serve on a mission trip to the Humanitarian Respite Center of Catholic Charities of the Rio Grande Valley (CCRGV), which is a first stop for people who have crossed the Texas border into the United States and have been processed and released by U.S. officials. The center provides a place for countless men, women, children and infants to rest, have a warm meal, a shower, and change into clean clothing, as well as receive medicine and other supplies, before continuing on their journey.

The mission was a diocesan project in cooperation with CCWTN, which made the trip at the request of Catholic Charities USA and with the approval of our Bishop, His Excellency, the most Rev. Martin D. Holley, D.D. CCWTN was the first Catholic Charities agency in the U.S. invited to assist at the center, which serves about 300 people each day with just a staff of four and volunteers. The Memphis team included Catholic Charities staff, Catholic community leaders and local Catholic high school students.

While there, our team worked to improve processes and organize donations at the respite center. We noticed that some of the arriving families hadn't eaten for days and had to be reintroduced to food. They were served a broth and noodle soup with small spoons as they arrived, so they wouldn't consume the food so quickly that they became sick. Water was served in small paper cups.

Sister Norma Pimentel, executive director CCRGV, oversees the ministry of the respite center. Sister Norma doesn't just provide food and clothing; she serves dignity and hope to everyone she meets. I found her to be a living legend and gift from God. She is pictured above with the students from all four Memphis Catholic high schools who participated.

In spite of the incredible stress these families are under, I never saw one outburst in my eight days of working with them. They gave thanks before every meal and fed their children first. They thanked everyone who worked at the respite center continu-

ally. And the children were simply children, laughing at silliness just as my grandchildren do. One little girl we met told one of our teenagers, "Please don't ever forget me. I love you with all my heart." I will never forget these people who I had the privilege to serve, and I am forever grateful that my wife, Kathy, and I were able to represent both Catholic Charities and St. Pat-



rick's Catholic Church to share God's love with them and welcome the stranger, as our Lord has taught us.
