

In **Celebration of**

September 23, 2018 we read the words of [Mary M. McGlone, CSJ](#):

[Jesus] picked up a child to show his argumentative disciples what it looks like to be in first place in the reign of God. What was he trying to teach them as he put his arms around the child? Perhaps that like the child, they had been chosen not for their importance or even their potential, but because they were loved. Their mission was not to perform mighty works, but to receive the little ones, the needy, the forgotten and the rejected. Their mission was to share the love they had been given so freely. They were called to the humble, humbling service of embracing the little people just as Jesus did.

When Jesus picked up the child, he was performing a living parable, teaching that loving someone is the greatest service you can do them; everything else flows from that and nothing else is very valuable without it. Loving is also the greatest service we can do for the entire world because the more people are loved, the less they need to compete and use violence to make their mark.

In the Eucharist we meet Jesus who lives the lesson of self-giving love.

From the St. Patrick Archives

Yellow Fever Epidemic 1878

—*Jackson Tribune and Sun*, 20th: "Father Doyle, for some time past in charge of St. Mary's parish, in this city, leaves to-day for Memphis. There is scarcely a priest of the Catholic Church left alive in Memphis, and Father Doyle goes by order of his bishop, to administer to the sick and dying and perform the last rites for the dead. It looks like marching straight into the jaws of death, but the brave christian knight goes without a murmur and with a smile of peace and love in his modest face. The love and prayers of all christian people in Jackson follow the brave priest, and God bless and spare him is on every tongue. He takes with him for the sufferers \$100, contributed by the communicants of St. Mary's parish of this city."



On Saturday October 20th, we will have our second all parishioner work day, by engaging two shifts of workers, with the first starting at 8 AM and going until noon. We will feed both shifts from 12 - 1, and the second crew will work from 1-4:30 or so. Projects will include power washing the front of the church, repairing concrete steps, landscaping projects, inside painting in the upstairs level of the church and about 50 more projects. What would normally cost us tens



of thousands of dollars to have repaired, will only cost us about \$2K in supplies. We would love to see more than 70 people helping out please. Dave Smith will be sending out more information in the next few weeks.

The Courtyard

The two great big drains (affectionately referred to as our elephant traps) that are in our parish courtyard were modified this week to become less of a hazard for anyone walking or playing in this area. Dave Smith and the building and grounds team installed the drains this past Tuesday and Phil Novarese, Phil Woodard and Ryan Woodard worked in the 98 degree heat on Thursday to fill in the considerable amount of needed dirt.

Pipe Organ Restoration Progress Report from Tom Helms

Our recent organ restoration installment now completes the cleaning and repair to the pipes of the SWELL division of the organ which plays from the top keyboard. Please remember that there are literally hundreds of smaller pipes behind the gold facade pipes as seen from your pew. Once all the SWELL pipes were carefully removed from the organ, 113 years of dust and debris were diligently vacuumed and wiped from the wind chest and pipes. All the wooden rack boards on the wind chest were thoroughly cleaned and refinished for protection. Much damage to the metal pipes was repaired including re-soldering broken zinc bass pipes. Previous attempts to raise the pitch of the organ had produced extensive damage to the mouths and tops of the delicate tin and lead alloy pipes. Such damage caused the pipes to split at the top and thus prevented them from playing today. Each pipe was carefully repaired and returned to its original 1905 pitch and condition. No tonal changes were made to the organ thus preserving its gentle character of tone. Most surprising is the fact that the "American Romantic" Saint Patrick organ is very flexible in design allowing it to play most of the great organ literature written by the masters. Our organ has no electrical connections to the keys or stops and is played entirely by mechanical means. Small strips of basswood form a solid attachment from key to pipe valve (the action) which the organist's fingers control with instantaneous response. All the great historical instruments across Europe employ this mechanical or "tracker" action. Instruments from as far back as the 1400s are still playing beautifully all across Europe.

Also during this last restoration installment the mechanical couplers were reinstalled and adjusted where the keyboards can be played on the pedalboard by the organist's feet.



Our pipe organ is quite a treasure for Saint Patrick Church and all of the people of Memphis. The love and energy of St. Patrick both past and present is most impressive.

Thank you for allowing me to share my life's work with your congregation.

After all Masses **October 14**, the Dorothy Day House will be taking pre-orders for Christmas wreaths and garlands as a fundraiser for their ministry to homeless families.

They will have multiple options available. You will be able to order items for yourself or order gifts with the direct delivery option, which is a wonderful way to buy wreaths for family members or friends, especially those who do not live in the Memphis area.

The Dorothy Day House (DDH) provides temporary housing and support services for homeless families in Memphis, Tennessee. Working with other local agencies, staff members and volunteers provide families in need with a safe environment and the means to re-establish their independence.

Since the DDH opened in May 2006, we have had 60 resident families. In addition, we have helped numerous homeless families for whom we have not had space at the DDH with emergency needs, food, furniture, clothing, household supplies, etc. Most families have become homeless because of trauma (e.g., fire, violence, death of a wage earner) or unemployment/under-employment. Some come from families who have lived in poverty for many generations.

In the spirit of Dorothy Day, the House relies on a people-helping-people model to provide transitional housing for ordinary families who have simply hit a rough spot in life. We help them over that rough spot by utilizing the talents of hundreds of volunteers to serve them in whatever way we can. Our philosophy is based on Dorothy Day's dictum, "The mystery of the poor is this: They are Jesus and what you do for them you do for Him."

The Dorothy Day House depends primarily on monetary and in-kind donations from private donors and organizations. While we are not officially associated with any church or denomination, we are rooted in the Christian Gospels, just as Dorothy Day was.
