



### Yearly Retreat

A Note from Father Val--

Every priest in the diocese is expected to make a yearly retreat. Exactly a year ago, I made my retreat as a conclusion to my 3-month sabbatical. Then, I arrived to begin my pastoral ministry with you at St. Patrick's.

I'll begin my eight-day retreat after presiding at the 5:15 p.m. Mass on Thursday, November 1st, celebrating the Holy Day of All Saints. I'll end the retreat at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 8th, and will make this retreat at our diocesan retreat house in Dancyville, TN (an hour's drive from here).



I'll be making the "Spiritual Exercises" of St. Ignatius Loyola. My retreat director will be Sister Ellen Buchignani, R.S.M. I'll be making this retreat with Father Al Kirk and others. Throughout the eight days there is silence throughout the time, except when each retreatant meets with his/her retreat director once a day (for about 30-40 minutes). Beware: When I finish my silent retreat, that following Sunday, November 11th, I'll be really eager to talk a lot for the homily!

For Sunday, November 4th, Monsignor Peter Buchignani (former Vicar General of our diocese) will preside at the 8:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses. Father David Knight will preside at the 5:15 p.m. Mass.

## **AROUND THE DIOCESE**

#### Changes Within the Catholic Diocese of Memphis

Statements from Father Val and the Archbishop of Louisville, Most Reverend Joseph E. Kurtz, D.D. Announced October 24, 2018:

This morning the Vatican announced that Pope Francis "has removed from the pastoral care of the Diocese of Memphis" Bishop Martin D. Holley. Pope Francis also announced that he has appointed the Archbishop of Louisville, Joseph E. Kurtz, Apostolic Administrator of our diocese until a new Bishop of Memphis is named. Archbishop Kurtz will continue as the Archbishop of Louisville.



Probably you have learned of this transition through the media; however, I wanted to share the official notice with you. At the Sunday Masses this weekend, I'll speak more about this.

Friends: Let us pray for our Diocese of Memphis, asking for healing and a strengthening of our faith, hope and charity. Let us also pray for a wise choice of the new Bishop of Memphis. Finally, let us also pray for Bishop Holley--for his future ministry, for his healing, and for his happiness.

Dear Faithful of the Diocese of Memphis,

Relying on God's grace, I greet you with affection and with gratitude for the gift of our faith in Jesus Christ and in His Church.

On Wednesday, Pope Francis made public my appointment as apostolic administrator of the Diocese of Memphis. With this appointment, I will seek to provide care for the diocese until our Holy Father appoints a new bishop in the coming months. I am eager to work with the priests, curia, and faithful to promote stability, peace, and healing. I have admired the Church of Memphis for many years, particularly from my time as Bishop of Knoxville.

On Wednesday, I traveled to Memphis and had the opportunity to meet with Bishop Holley as he completed his service as your bishop. It was a meeting filled with mutual respect and dignity, and I ask for your prayers for him. Bishop Holley now has the status of bishop emeritus and will reside outside of the Diocese of Memphis.

I also had the opportunity to meet with the diocesan priest consultors and with those members of the Priests' Council who could assemble on short notice. I met as well with the diocesan staff who provide ministry throughout your local Church. It is with deep gratitude that I acknowledge their desire to reach out to all of the faithful in the hope that every Catholic in the diocese will be renewed in our commitment to follow Jesus Christ faithfully. Many spoke to me of the need for healing as we move forward. It is my hope that all of us together will seek unity in Christ in truth and love.

I want to assure you of my desire to serve you well. I hope to meet with all of the priests in early November. I also extend special thanks to the deacons, women and men religious, and lay ecclesial ministers who have served and will continue to serve so faithfully. Since I will continue to serve as the Archbishop of Louisville, I have appointed Father Robert W. Marshall, pastor of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, as my delegate to assist me during this time.

Please be assured of my prayers. I ask for your prayers as I seek to provide leadership with the mind and heart of Jesus Christ.

## The Big MICAH Meeting on Sunday Afternoon, October 21st a Great Success

The turn-out "quota" for the MICAH meeting last Sunday at the Mason Temple (where Dr. King gave his last sermon the night before he was martyred) was **50** from St. Patrick's. We made that number "quota," and ten parishioners were there more than two hours before the meeting's start and helped with all the details of registering and welcoming people.

There was a huge crowd--according to Parish Pastoral Council member, Don Farrell, there were **1500 persons present**! This great number also showed the rich racial and ethnic diversity of our city. Several elected officials and candidates for the coming election were present.

#### MICAH's efforts related to the former Foote Homes--

In the historic setting of the former Foote Homes (two blocks south of St. Patrick's), MICAH is committed to ensuring that former Foote Home residents truly become a part of the new housing development on that site. Of course, former Foote Home residents made up the lowest rung of low-income residents within our city.

During the meeting in the late afternoon of Sunday, October 21st, MICAH asked the following three questions to Mrs. Marcia Lewis, Executive Director of the Memphis Housing Authority. Parishioners from St. Patrick's had met with Mrs. Lewis on more than one occasion and, during the last meeting, went over these questions which she would be asked before the entire gathering on October 21st.

Mrs. Lewis said "yes" to each of the following three questions:

#### Are you willing to commit that, under your direction—

- · Ongoing work and contact will be given to all the former Foote Home residents?
- · A viable rent will be offered each household from the former Foote Home residents, which includes the lowest rung of the income range?
- That, as a result, 360 former Foote Home households will become residents of the new development on the site of the former Foote Homes, if they so choose?



## **Parish October Work Day**


Last Saturday, 32 St Patrick volunteers came together for 10 hours of work at helping to make St Patrick a little bit warmer and friendlier place for all. We don't have enough room in the bulletin to list all 32 names, but have included some photos. Here is a partial list of things we accomplished:




- 1. Removed plexiglas, used paint remover, scraped, primed and painted 5 stained glass windows (exterior wood). Very messy and labor intensive undertaking, but we need to get these frames sealed before the winter. This probably would have cost the parish \$10K to do professionally. Instead, we spent under \$300 in materials.
- 2. Another primer coat on front door portion that has been prepared. We had to wait for yesterdays wedding before getting the one remaining section to the company restoring the condition of the doors.
- 3. The right shade of green has been selected, so after the second set of doors is returned, then we will paint those doors. Hoping to get all this done in time for Christmas.
- 4. Dead tree/bush limbs were cut, garden by the Narthex doors was cleaned out and the rose bed under the St Pat's MLK sign was trimmed.




- 5. The concrete on the front and porch steps were repaired. The railing leading up to the front doors was straightened out.
- 6. All of the paint and building supplies were moved from the Narthex area to the basement





- 8. We painted the barricade posts in the back parking lot by the school back entrance. We will put a second coat on those soon.
- 9. The exterior store room door to the Center was prepped and a primer coat put on. We will be putting a second coat on there as well.
- 10. The metal strip by the school entrance ceiling was painted to better match the surrounding metal-work.
  - 11. The cross in the sanctuary was backlit.









It started off as a cold wet day, but ended up being a sensational day of blue sky and warm sunshine at Davy Crockett Golf course last Satur-


