### Parish Pastoral Council Meeting January 22 Parish Update

ParishWe had our last PPC meeting this past Tuesday 1/22/19, where we reviewed and reflected on the results of the Stewardship Meetings. ThePastoralStewardship Meetings seemed to confirm that the parish supports theCouncil6 priorities that were voted on after the house meetings last year and<br/>gave us ideas to focus moving forward for each ministry.

For Communications, there is a new website set to "go live" in February. We will start giving updates in the bulletin after each Parish Council Meeting (like this one) and focus on one ministry's updates each month in the bulletin, website and on social media. We discussed future plans to stream the Mass online for those who can't attend, creating a parish directory, restarting name tags and getting more listening devices for the hearing impaired available (we have 1 device currently).

For Social Outreach, we are using Sign up Genius which gives descriptions of volunteer jobs and how many people are needed for each position as well as links and information for people to sign up. We discussed ideas for ongoing "talent searches" in the parish to connect parishioners' gifts with needs of St. Patrick's and the community. We also talked about ongoing needs assessments of parishioners and neighbors. St Patrick's is participating in the Room at the Inn the last Wednesday night of January, February and March. Many people have volunteered but we still need more, so look out for more information to get involved if you are interested! We discussed continuing to be active with MICAH and giving regular updates to the parish, please let us know if you are interested in getting involved! We also discussed ways to collaborate with other nonprofits.

For Spiritual Growth, we discussed plans for a parish retreat and parish council retreat, another three part course with Fr. Bruce Cinquegrani this Lent, offering another Lector Training and plans for one or more Centering Prayer groups to be started. In addition, the windows and other repairs to the parish bus have been made with hopes of using it to bring people to Mass who can't get here otherwise.

For Music Ministry, we recognized the need for on-going cultural diversity in the music and incorporating a choir more regularly, as we did on Christmas Eve.

For Building and Grounds, we talked about creating a Master Plan for what work needs to be done as what we hope for.

Deacon Frank, Don, Ro and Jennifer are working on the bylaws of the Parish Council. Deacon Frank announced that St. Vincent DePaul will be coming to St. Pats. This is a worldwide ministry of over 800,000 members, whose purpose is to grow spiritually through visiting people in need where they live, finding out their needs, bringing Christ to them by helping them whatever way we can and in the process finding Christ in them. There will be announcements after Mass this weekend for more information about how to get involved.

Our next Parish Council meeting will be February 28th, 6-7:30pm in the Braganza Room.

In the name of my family, I want to thank all of you for your prayers for my sister Kay, who was in a horrific one-car crash this past November 27<sup>th</sup>. Kay has made an amazing recovery, and many of you have seen her at Mass, starting on our Christmas Eve Mass, with her husband Tom.

Two weeks ago Kay had an appointment with the specialist regarding her most serious injury—a fracture of C2 vertebra. She has been in a neck brace since the accident. The results from this doctor's meeting were not what we had hoped. Please continue your prayer that her neck will heal properly without surgery.

One other update: Last summer Kay and Tom planned to take a cruise in the Caribbean under the auspices of the Notre Dame Alumni Association. Unfortunately, Kay's neck doctor strongly advised them not to take the cruise. The next day, Tom contacted me. The cruise tickets are nonrefundable. He asked if I would like to go on this cruise in their place. I said 'yes!' The cruise will leave on Sunday, February 10<sup>th</sup>, and end on Monday, February 18<sup>th</sup>.
