



Participants journey through the 40 days of Lent with a collection of daily reflections and activities included in the CRS Rice Bowl calendar and on the mobile app. Through CRS Rice Bowl, participants are invited to hear stories about their brothers and sisters in need around the





world, and devote their Lenten prayers, fasting and alms to change the lives of those who suffer in poverty. Our United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' website tells us that "Catholic social teaching proclaims that we are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they live.

We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Learning to practice the virtue of solidarity means learning that 'loving our neighbor' has global dimensions in an interdependent world. This virtue is described by John Paul II as 'a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all' (Sollicitudo Rei Socialis)"

Parish Pastoral Council Revised ByLaws

Dear Parishioners,

The 2020-2021 Parish Pastoral Council of St. Patrick Church began its work in "pandemic mode," responding to changes in our parish life necessitated by the onset of that worldwide crisis—in fact, our very first meeting on March 18, 2020, was all about how to respond to that urgency, before we could even develop a sense of ourselves as a body of servant leaders. Over the last ten months, we have seen the need to reorient ourselves to all the other elements of pastoral care, beyond our health and safety. Part of that process involved reexamining the Bylaws that serve as a guide to our functioning. We wanted to share with you that entire document and highlight a few changes on which we came to consensus. The revised Bylaws of the St. Patrick Church Pastoral Council:

- Include language from the Office of the Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Memphis on parish pastoral councils, to emphasize our relationship with our diocese (Article 2).
- Clarify the selection procedures for new members of the Pastoral Council, creating a timeline for the discernment and election process (Article 3, Section 3).
- Add language to the expectations for Pastoral Council members focused on accountability to the pastor, to each other, and to all parishioners (Article 3, Section 5).
- Simplify and clarify the descriptions of roles of Pastoral Council members (Article 4) and of parish "teams," both standing and pro tem (Article 6).
- Add a section formalizing the long-standing relationship of the Pastoral Council to the Finance Council (Article Seven).

We hope that you will look over this revision of the Bylaws of the Pastoral Council, published (here). We also pray that our careful and prayerful examination of the document will make us even more committed to the pastoral care of the parish, as we move into another year. Please pray for us all.
