



Commemoration of Hiroshima and Nagasaki August 6 and 9



Sunflowers are the symbol of a world free of nuclear weapons. In view of the upcoming anniversaries of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, a presentation of sunflowers or sunflower images in church re-

minds us of our role in freeing the world of nuclear weapons.

Paper cranes: ancient Japanese tradition holds that one who folds a thousand paper cranes will receive what one



wishes for. Today, cranes signify our determination to eliminate nuclear weapons.

Public Art Project Draws Attention to Growing Number of Pedestrian Deaths



The Heights Neighborhood commissioned artist Colin Kidder (St. Patrick parishioner) to create an art installation honoring Memphians killed walking in 2020.

There were 38 pedestrian fatalities in 2019. In 2020, there were 64 pedestrian deaths.

Melvin, Sherita and Jessie are a few of the 64 names you'll find on crosswalk figures on National Street. They represent people killed while walking in Memphis in 2020.

The installation will be on National Street (north of Summer Avenue) until the end of the month. The artist said they're looking to move to new locations throughout the city.

During the time I'm away, there will be no weekday Masses at St. Patrick's.


Deacon Frank will preach during all three Masses on Sunday, August 8th. I'll preside at all three of these Masses.


