
needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

St. Martin de Porres Pilgrimage for Racial Justice and Reconciliation

October 30th, 2021

Join us as we make our pilgrimage from the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception to the National Shrine of St. Martin de Porres during the Shrine's triduum celebration of St. Martin's feast day. Pilgrims will stop along the way at the grave of Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman and outside the National Civil Rights Museum before arriving at the Shrine for Mass followed by dinner and fellowship. We will be seeking St. Martin's intercession for justice and healing in our local Catholic community, our wider Memphis community, and our nation.

PILGRIMAGE SCHEDULE

- 1:00pm Gathering at the Cathedral for a pilgrims' blessing led by Deacon Norman Alexander
- 1:30pm Set out from the Cathedral for Elmwood Cemetery to visit Sr. Thea Bowman's grave
- 2:30pm Arrive at the cemetery and spend time in prayer at the gravesite
- 2:45pm Depart the cemetery for the National Civil Rights Museum
- 4:00pm Arrive outside the National Civil Rights Museum for prayer and reflection
- 4:15pm Depart for the National Shrine of St. Martin de Porres
- 4:45pm Arrive at the National Shrine
- 5:00pm Mass at the Shrine celebrated by Fr. Eduardo Logiste, O.P.
- 6:00pm Dinner and fellowship at the Shrine

There will be a shuttle service to get pilgrims back to the Cathedral as needed.

The entire pilgrimage route is approximately 6.5 miles. From Elmwood Cemetery to the Shrine is approximately 4 miles. From the National Civil Rights Museum to the Shrine is just over 1 mile. Pilgrims are welcome to join us for the whole length of the journey or to join us at one of our stops along the way to the Shrine, and any and all are invited to attend the Mass and dinner.

After Mass, set out the juice and lemonade, greet, mingle, and monitor the supplies, return the juice and lemonade to the fridge.




