





We are asking the St. Patrick Church Community to donate knit hats. Our


goal is 50 hats. Hats may be purchased, handmade, or gently used in good condition. Please avoid red and bright blue; navy blue is fine.



Procedure for Reporting Sexual Abuse

Anyone who has knowledge of or who has cause to suspect an incident of sexual abuse should report the information to the appropriate civil authorities first at 1-877-237-0004, then to the Diocesan Director of Child & Youth Protection at 901-359-2027
