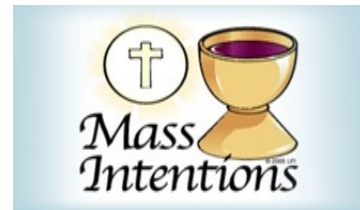

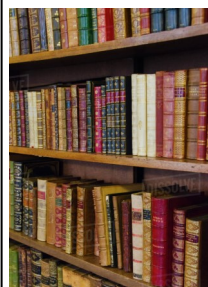

World Day of the Poor Sunday, November 15 Society of St. Vincent de Paul Second Collection

Today, November 14, is World Day of the Poor, observed by the universal Church around the world. St. Patrick Church honors the day with a second collection at each of our Masses for the Society of St. Vincent de Paul conference at our parish.

In his message for the fifth World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis tells us, “Jesus not only sides with the poor; he also *shares their lot*. This is a powerful lesson for his disciples in every age. The poor will always be with us, yet that should not make us indifferent, but summon us instead to a mutual sharing of life that does not allow proxies. The poor are not people “outside” our communities, but brothers and sisters whose sufferings we should share, in an effort to alleviate their difficulties and marginalization, restore their lost dignity and ensure their necessary social inclusion.”



This is what makes the work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at St. Patrick Church align so well with the Pope’s summons to observe World Day of the Poor. Our conference seeks out the poor and marginalized in our 38126 neighborhood, because this is how we experience our call to meet Christ. We establish direct, personal relationships with those in need and attend to their particular situations. This is how we are able to “catch” some of those who fall through the cracks of larger institutions:

- ♦ like the senior facing extra expenses incurred by caring for her sister while her sister recovered from surgery--her hardship didn’t fall into any of the categories stipulated by other aid agencies
- ♦ like the woman facing a utility cut-off who could not access utility help offered to seniors because she was weeks shy of her 65th birthday
- ♦ like the disabled single father of two teenagers who could not get help with extra expenses during Covid 19 because he had not experienced a loss of income directly from the pandemic.



Often the greatest benefit to neighbors like these is not the financial assistance we provide, but the hope engendered by the human warmth of personal contact and support—of “stretching out our hands.”

The St. Patrick conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul invites you to participate in the work of stretching out hands of help and hope to our 38126 neighbors. Please be generous with the second collection on November 14. 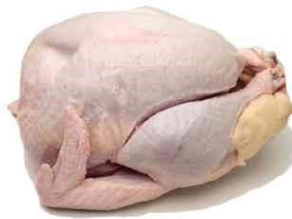

Catholic Campaign for Human Development Second Collection November 21



November 21st, there will be a 2nd collection in all Catholic parishes in the United States for the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development**. For more than 30 years this national collection has been taken up on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. Next week our second collection will support the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. More than thirty-eight million people in the United States live in poverty. This collection supports programs that empower people to identify and address the obstacles they face as they work to bring permanent and positive change to their communities.

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development is the national anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops, working to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ "... to bring glad tidings to the poor ... liberty to captives ... sight to the blind, and let the oppressed go free." (Luke 4:18)

The belief that those who are directly affected by unjust systems and structures have the best insight into knowing how to change them is central to CCHD. CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty by helping low-income people participate in decisions that affect their lives, families and communities. CCHD offers a hand up, not a hand out.

"The future of humanity does not lie solely in the hands of great leaders, the great powers and the elites. It is fundamentally in the hands of peoples and in their ability to organize. It is in their hands, which can guide with humility and conviction this process of change. I am with you." - Pope Francis



The CCHD works with community groups such as MICAHA here in Memphis to find solutions to local problems, to create businesses, and to find ways to improve their lives. St. Patrick Church is an institutional member of MICAHA.

Procedure for Reporting Sexual Abuse

Anyone who has knowledge of or who has cause to suspect an incident of sexual abuse should report the information to the appropriate civil authorities first at 1-877-237-0004, then to the Diocesan Director of Child & Youth Protection at 901-359-2027
