

## **Stations of the Cross** Through the Neighborhood with Father Bruce Nieli, C.S.P.! Good Friday, April 15, Noon Parking Lot Behind St. Patrick Church

Please join us at **NOON on Good Friday** as we walk the Stations of the Cross at historical and everyday landmarks throughout our downtown neighborhood. We walk through the neighborhood carrying a cross, stopping at



various points of interest related to social justice, to pray and reflect. The journey begins in the St. Patrick School parking lot and ends inside the Church. Station locations include the Civil Rights Museum, WLOK, Clayborn Temple, Ida B. Wells Memorial, as well as other everyday sites.

Fr. Bruce Nieli, C.S.P. will lead us in reflection at each stop and in song

with his guitar as we process on the journey. It's a unique tradition at St. Pat's, which provides a profound and deeply spiritual experience.



This is a family-friendly event, so load up the baby

slings and the strollers. Transportation will be available for those who would like to participate but are una-

ble to walk the route, and water will

be available as needed.

Following the Stations, join us for our Good Friday Service at 3:00pm in the Church.

# Foot and Hand Washing at our Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper

In the Gospel on Holy Thursday, we hear these words from Jesus, after he had washed the feet of his disciples:

"Do you understand what I just did for you? You address me as 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and fittingly enough, for that is what I am. But if I washed your feet – I who am Teacher and Lord – then you must wash each other's feet. What I just did was to give you an example: as I have done, so you must do." (John 13:12-15)



Here, at St. Patrick's, we take that responsibility seriously. As we strive to **see** Jesus in others, and **be** Jesus **for** others, we welcome this opportunity for us to be Jesus for each other in a special way, and to allow ourselves to experience Jesus's love for us.

Following our Liturgy of the Word, we will reenact the Washing of the Feet from the story of the Last Supper. You will have the opportunity to have your own feet (or hands) washed, and in turn, wash someone else's, in an active commemoration of what Jesus taught us about service to others. We have added the hand washing stations because there are some who, for whatever reason, are not able to have their feet washed, or to bend and wash another's.

We will have 6 stations altogether – 2 along each side, in the corners, for washing feet and 1 in the middle of them, along each side, for washing hands. Please come to have your hands or feet washed, then wait and wash the hands or feet of the next person. We ask that you consider letting your neighbor have the honor of washing either your feet or hands. What would it be like to have God's own Son before me to wash my feet as a symbol of what He would do to cleanse my soul?





### THE FRUIT OF OUR LENTEN SACRIFICE



Over the past few weeks, we traveled to Guatemala, Bangladesh and Rwanda, where families are doing some pretty amazing things. Let's review what we learned:

We all have dreams. What we do to achieve those dreams makes a difference in our lives and the lives of those we love. Raúl and Lilian achieved their dream of starting a business. Now they hope to grow that business so others can benefit. Noornobi wanted to help his family succeed. Now his niece and nephew can attend school and work towards their dreams. Gloriose and her husband wanted their children to attend a good school. Now they earn enough money to make that happen.



Many children around the world are malnourished, so their parents and communities are going the extra mile to make sure they get better. Raúl and Lilian sell their produce to schools so children in their village have fresh fruits and vegetables. Noornobi's family didn't always have enough to eat. Now he makes enough money, so his family can eat every day. Gloriose learned how to prepare balanced meals for her children so they can grow and be strong.



Sometimes it takes hard work and a desire to learn new things to succeed. Even though Raúl and Lilian lost many crops at first, they kept trying. Noornobi's land flooded often before he learned how to keep the floods away. Gloriose learned how to save money and apply for a loan to grow her business and support her family.







Although we are in the final days of Lent, there's still plenty of time to continue the three pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to grow with God and our sisters and brothers around the world. Just like how you have to practice reading or math or playing your favorite sport or instrument, we have to practice these pillars regularly—even when it's not Lent.

### DECREE

The beginning of this pandemic, around March of 2020, seems like a life-time ago. From the beginning of this health, cultural and spiritual crisis, the GOLDEN RULE of the Risen Lord Jesus has been our guide in this and in every issue that we face as a Diocese (Leviticus 19. 18, 34; Matthew 7.12; Luke 6.31). Even today, even with the new variants of this virus, we follow the Way of Life as we seek to love God and neighbor, as Jesus instructs us.

From what I have seen and heard, most of our people have returned to the Sunday celebration of holy Mass. We need to come back and renew the strength of each parish community of faith. We need to hold sacred "the LORD's DAY", the eighth day of Creation, the celebration of His victory over sin and death. SUNDAY needs to be a marker we offer in our Christian witness, a sign of our faith-life, our discipleship.

As has been mentioned before, please note that "If participation in the Eucharistic celebration becomes impossible because of the absence of a sacred minister or another grave cause, it is strongly recommended that the faithful...devote themselves to prayer for suitable time alone, as a family... (canon 1248)". What is a grave cause that would make it impossible to meet the "Sunday obligation"? Granting the continued presence of this infectious new coronavirus among our people, any health precondition that makes the person or parent or health provider more vulnerable to COVID 19...this kind of issue is the kind of grave cause mentioned in the canon above.

<u>I continue to ask all Catholics and their families and friends to join your Pastor in the fellowship of our Catholic parishes, for Sunday Mass, for holy days of obligation and for the ongoing formation of our lives, lived in Christ the Lord.</u>

### Please note the instructions below:

- The withholding of the cup of blessing (chalices for Holy Communion) during holy Mass is lifted. It is up to each Pastor and Administrator, to discern when the saving cup might be offered again in the celebration of holy Mass.
- Facial coverings (masks) are optional. For those that desire this protection, each Pastor should remain attentive to the health concerns of those who may be more vulnerable to health issues as a result of this new virus.

This Decree is given on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February 2022 and takes effect on Holy Thursday, the 14<sup>th</sup> of April 2022. I am yours, in the light and love of the Risen Lord,
