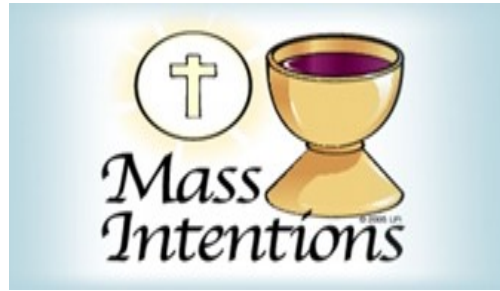

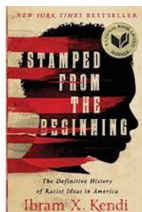

Each parishioner may vote for up to four (4) candidates. Please vote only once.

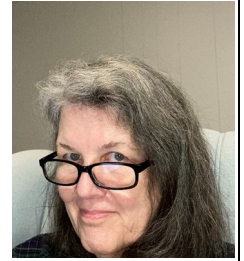

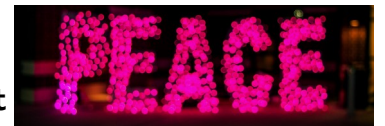

Meet our Patron and Founder!



Today is Ozanam Sunday, in recognition of Blessed Frederic Ozanam, founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

St. Vincent de Paul and Blessed Frederic Ozanam were centuries apart, but they had one thing in common—a heart for the poor. As a pastor, St. Vincent de Paul *organized* his parishioners to minister to the suffering in an efficient way, while always maintaining direct contact with those in need. Frederic Ozanam, while a college student, likewise organized his fellow students to accompany him into the slums of Paris to minister directly to the poor. Ozanam and his friends took St. Vincent de Paul as their patron and founded the Society that has since spread all around the world.

A group of St. Patrick parishioners is continuing the work of the Society, serving our neighbors in the 38126 zip code area. We invite you to help make our group larger, more organized, and more efficient at serving Christ in those in need, and to join us in growing spiritually together. Our ministry involves serving our neighbors in the poorest area of the city through providing short-term financial assistance and future-oriented financial management help—always beginning with person-to-person contact and truly befriending those we help, according to the charism of our founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam.

Our St. Patrick conference is also a group of friends—friends who grow spiritually together through fellowship, prayer, and service. We would love to have you join us. 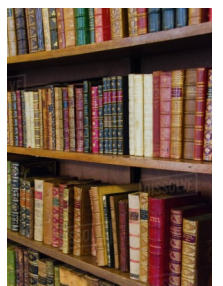
