Easter Lilies to Enjoy for Years to Come!

Help yourself to the Easter Lilies from the church. The plants are located in the church lobby by the playground.

These beautiful indoor Easter lily plants are really hardy perennials, so don't throw them out. Plant them outdoors to beautify your landscape instead! To prepare for planting outdoors, remove all of the flowers once the plant's flowers have faded. This forces the plant to enlarge the bulb rather than producing flower seeds. Then, keep the plant(s) in bright, indirect light until nighttime temperatures stay above 40 degrees outdoors. Plant your lilies about 6 inches deep, in a partially-sunny site with well-drained soil. Cover with several inches of mulch before winter for winter protection. Lilies planted this way should bloom mid-summer next year and many years thereafter.

Procedure for Reporting Sexual Abuse

Anyone who has knowledge of or who has cause to suspect an incident of sexual abuse should report the information to the appropriate civil authorities first at 1-877-237-0004, then to the Diocesan Director of Child & Youth Protection at 901-359-2027 or the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 901-652-4066.
