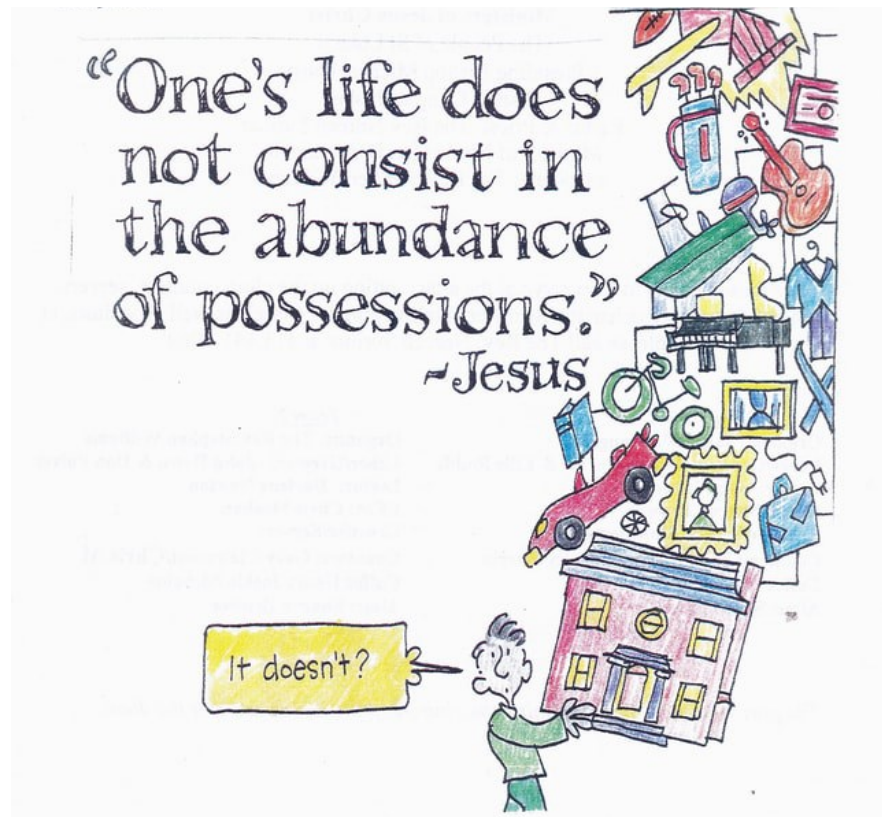

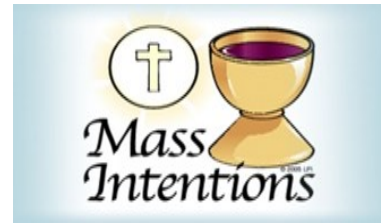

Notre Dame Club Annual Game Bus Trip

Did you ever want to experience the beautiful Notre Dame campus for a football game? Or wish to take a friend or family member to a game? Maybe you have child interested in ND for college and want to take a campus tour. The Notre Dame Club of Memphis has seats available on their annual bus trip to South Bend. 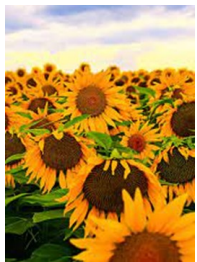

Commemoration of Hiroshima and Nagasaki August 6 and 9



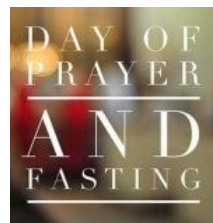

Black arm bands denoting mourning and grief -- appropriate sentiments in view of the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945.

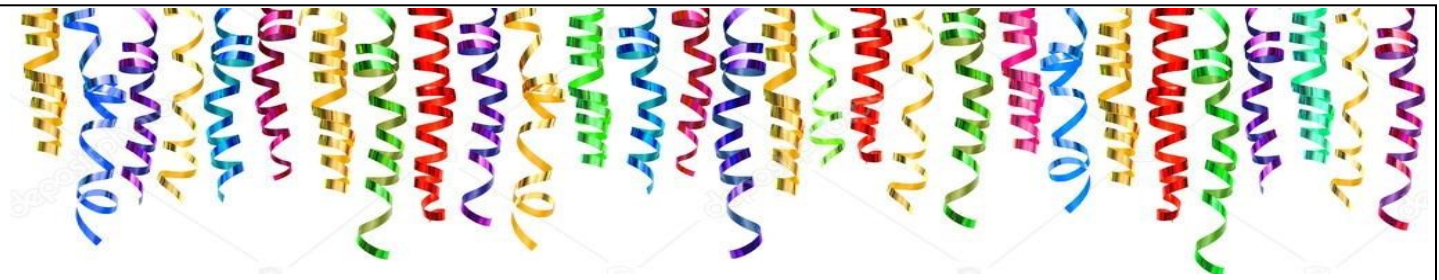

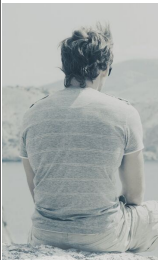

St. Patrick Tanzania Global Health Ministry Update

St. Patrick's parishioners are joining forces with Catholic sisters in Tanzania to fund a medical clinic. Funds are being raised not only for construction but also for supplies and equipment.

So far, we have raised \$3,800, and are hoping to raise another \$2,800 to complete the construction of the clinic. The clinic will serve about 900 people a year and enable doctors to not only provide care in the village of Kifuru but also in the surrounding rural areas that currently lack care.

This clinic will provide maternity care and ongoing care for young mothers and their children. A special dinner is set for Sept. 10 at 6 p.m. featuring Tanzania dishes, specially prepared by Inspire Cafe and hosted by Barrie and Mike Simpson at their home in Central Gardens.
