





St. Patrick Tanzania Global Health Ministry Update



St. Patrick's parishioners are joining forces with Catholic sisters in Tanzania to fund a medical clinic. Funds are being raised not only for construction but also for supplies and equipment.



So far, we have raised \$3,800, and are hoping to raise another \$2,800 to complete the construction of the clinic. The clinic will serve about 900 people a

year and enable doctors to not only provide care in the village of Kifuru but also in the surrounding rural areas that currently lack care. This clinic will provide maternity care and ongoing care for young mothers and their children.

An update from...

Parish PASTORAL Council

Dear community,

At the August meeting of your Pastoral Council, members took a deeper dive into a more "synodal" process for our meeting format. By prayerfully considering what we saw as the priorities of the community and listening to each other's inspirations for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we discovered several themes emerging:

A desire for more "invitational" outreach to those beyond our official membership: persons who live on the streets; persons who live in our surrounding neighborhoods, especially in Foote Park; other downtown churches; visitors and newcomers, etc.—efforts encompassing ecumenism, evangelization, and hospitality!

A need for a dedicated social justice ministry that would take meaningful action for justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion, in the St. Pat's and Memphis communities.

A need for a robust Youth Ministry and the hiring of a Youth Ministry Director at St. Pat's.

A desire for a ministry focused on Earthcare, "care for our common home."

Your Pastoral Council members want to engage with you about *your* hopes for our parish priorities. If you have any ideas for these or other ministries, or if you would like to participate in these or other efforts, please let a Pastoral Council member know.

Our next Pastoral Council "synod" will be Wednesday, August 31, at 6:00 p.m., in the atrium lobby. It is our intention to take up, first, the priorities of evangelization and Youth Ministry, but of course we make room for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. If you are aware of that inspiration coming through you, please speak up to a Pastoral Council member! We are striving to become a more synodal, "listening" body, walking together with *all* of our St. Pat's community.


