Habakkuk 1.2-3; 2.2-4

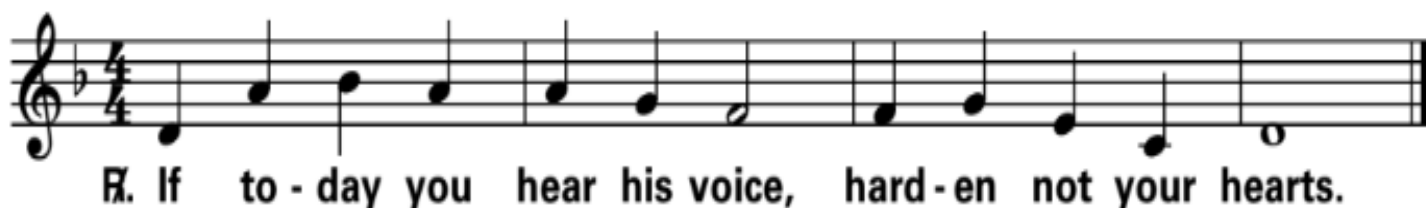

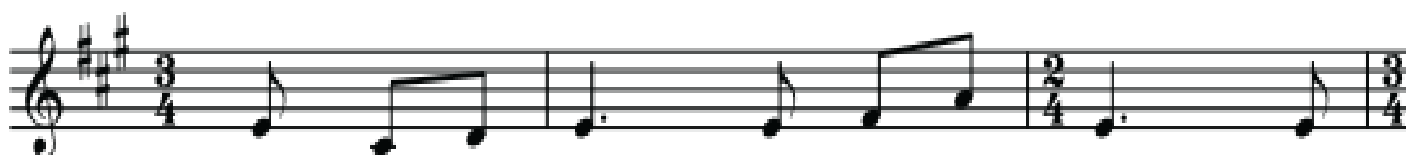
Profession of Faith:
