"How long, O Lord, I cry for help but you do not listen?"

Don't we make that complaint at God as well? God, I'm not—we're not—a work of art, but a disaster, worth nothing. And God answers: "For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it...it will not delay...The righteous person lives by their faith."

Yes, Friends: We're called to hold onto faith in our God. It's an unwavering, firm loyalty to God...trusting that God has a dream for us. Much more than how much we want it, much more God wants "to set us free."

Over time, the masterpiece in that block of white marble—well, Michelangelo kept chipping away. The dream was there, waiting to be set free.

St. Patrick's, that's why we need each other. We need to hold onto that faith together, especially when we complain, "How long, O God!"
