

How did they recognize him? Why was their joy so great? One of the great themes that emerges in the prophecies and Infancy Narratives we read during Advent and Christmas in the Church could be stated as, "Our joy is in proportion to our longing."



#### Written by a former parishioner in 2015

"This is my story, this is my song," words taken from *Blessed Assurance* written by Frances Cosley in 1873, still ring true today. Last Wednesday evening was my first time to participate in the **ROOM in the INN** here at St. Patrick. We provided a warm shelter for twelve men and two women; they all came with their own stories. As we gathered around the table set with white table clothes, beautiful flower arrangements and a meal served on real china, we listened to their stories unfold and the pieces of the song came together. How was I to know that evening I would meet a homeless man whose sister I had attended high school with, and the middle aged man who had just found

out he had cancer, not knowing what his outcome would be. There was Tony who prayed a beautiful blessing before our meal, asked me to spell his name backwards – YNOT. The whole evening was a blessing for me and everyone who was there to serve. Taken from the book *Radical Hospitality* written by Fr. Homan and Lonni Pratt, hospitality is not about what you do, it is about who you are becoming. You can press the linens, invite the homeless, and serve the ham, but unless you are willing to let people into your locked up secret place, you will remain alone and so will they. Not knowing what to expect when I arrived Wednesday evening, my heart slowly opened and was touched by each person there.




