



JEDI = **Justice** + **Equity** + **Diversity** + **Inclusion**

During the month of November, our bulletin featured a JEDI Spotlight on the Saints in observance of National Black Catholic History month. We read about Sr. Thea Bowman, Fr. Augustus Tolton, Helen Caldwell Day, and Julia Greeley – all with connections to St. Patrick's church, either physically or through parishioners. The JEDI group here at St. Patrick's is continuing this Spotlight on the Saints. For the next several Sundays we will be looking at a few of the many diverse appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary in different times and throughout the world.

Our Lady of Knock

On the evening of August 21, 1879, Mary McLoughlin, the housekeeper to the parish priest of the village of Knock, County Mayo, Ireland, was astonished to see the south wall of the parish church bathed in a mysterious light, as she rushed through the rain to her friend Margaret Byrne's house. After a short visit, Mary McLoughlin left her friend's house, and Margaret's sister Mary Byrne agreed to walk home with

her. As they passed the Church of St. John the Baptist again, both saw on the outside wall of the church a tableaux of fully rounded, glowing figures that appeared to be alive. Mary Byrne ran to tell her family while Mary McLough-

lin gazed at the apparition. Soon 15 other persons gathered, ranging in age from 5 to 75 years. Everyone who came saw the same apparition of Mary, wearing a white garment with a golden sash and a white cloak. Our Lady was described by the witnesses as being incredibly beautiful. She wore a bright golden crown, and appeared to be praying. On her right was Saint Joseph, his head inclined toward her, and on her left was Saint John the Evangelist. Saint John wore a miter, and appeared to be preaching. To the left of Saint John was an altar on which stood a cross and a lamb.

In many other apparitions of Mary, as at Fatima and Lourdes, Our Lady has spoken a message. In the apparition of Our Lady of Knock, none of the figures spoke, but the biblical and liturgical images convey a symbolic message. The Lamb on the altar calls to mind the

presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The apparition of Our Lady of Knock is therefore considered a Eucharistic apparition as well. Since Mary is portrayed as the main worshiper, her symbolism is comprehensive: she is the ideal model which the Church is called to imitate. Pope Francis said that Our Lady of Knock's silence contains yet another important message: "The message which comes from Knock is that of **the great value of silence for our faith.**"

Others have pondered, as well, the significance of this apparition of Mary in Ireland at this particular time. It seems likely that Mary's silence echoes the silencing of the Irish in the 1800s—for if anyone knows the plight of those who suffer in silence, it is the Blessed Mother. Ireland had gone through radical social and spiritual upheaval since the 1600s. The "Curse of Cromwell," named after Oliver Cromwell's anti-Catholic invasion of Ireland, plagued the Irish throughout the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries. Few Irish owned land; most property remained in English landowners' hands. Despite persecution from Protestant English landowners and nobles, famine, and the suppression of the Irish language, many of the native Irish had remained Catholic. The silenced people of Ireland received, in the apparition of Our Lady of Knock, a silent visit from saintly protectors.


