

# With deep sadness...

# Dear St. Patrick Parishioners, and other Friends--

I write in order to share with you that Hank Haney, husband of Shannon Curtis our Pastoral Assistant, died today just after noon. After her husband's death, Shannon asked that I let all of you know.

A week ago Hank came down with a cold and, by last Thursday afternoon, it went into pneumonia. (As you may remember, about five months ago Hank was hospitalized in ICU for a week with pneumonia.) In neither case did the medical staff find out the cause for the severity of his illnesses.

Later last Thursday, in the ER at Methodist University Hospital, Hank "crashed" and had seizures. He was intubated and, when there was an open room, he was taken to the ICU.

On Friday Hank had a MRI to see about the seizures and their effect. Shannon got the results on this past Sunday morning. The neurologists told her that the MRI showed that there was extensive brain damage and that he would never regain consciousness.

Shannon knew that Hank would want to be an organ donor. It took a couple of days for the arrangements to be made with the hospital and the Mid-South Transplant Foundation.

On Monday night two dear friends of Hank, Angus and James, came down from Virginia and were with us this morning. At 11:00 a.m., after the two of them, Shannon and I had prayer in his ICU room, there was what is called the "Honor Walk." It is a tribute to Hank, as it is done with all organ donors shortly before their death. Hank's bed was slowly rolled down the hall, and Shannon and the three others of us followed behind. All the medical staff on that ICU floor stood in silence on both sides of the hallway, as Hank was being taken to the elevator and to the surgery room on a lower floor. It was a deeply moving moment.

When all was prepared in the surgery room for Hank to be extubated, Shannon alone and the Family Care Coordinator for the Mid-South Transplant Foundation then went down to the surgery room. Shannon was with her husband, holding his hand, as he was extubated, and Hank died peacefully. Then Shannon returned and joined us.

After a separate physician certified his death, another team came in and harvested Hank's liver, kidneys and tissue. His donation will give life--or much improved living--to at least 75 persons!

Shannon knows how all of you have been with Hank and her in prayer during these very painful days. She deeply appreciates your love and support.

No other plans have been made yet. When they are, I shall let you know. How can you be of help and support now to Shannon? I suggest that we continue to lift her up in prayer. When I or others find out how else we can be of help, we--or Shannon herself--will let you know her wishes.

Yes, these have been very hard days. It shows me how deeply cherished is a close church community like St. Patrick's. Shannon has done so much to cultivate that closeness, love, and shared faith. Now, we can minister together to Shannon in these coming weeks and months.

"Eternal rest grant unto Hank, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace."

As St. Paul teaches us, "We do not want you to be unaware, sisters and brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope" (1 Thessalonians 4:13).

Let's sustain one another in that hope.
