StBenedict AT AUBURNDALE

Dear Msgr. Valentine,

Greetings from St. Benedict! We want to share some news about the recently approved Education Savings Account and how it can benefit all Catholic schools and students who opt to participate.

St. Benedict is participating with our partner Catholic Parish churches and schools. Attached you will find more detailed information about this opportunity. To summarize, for families who qualify, the State of Tennessee will reimburse the family approximately \$8,200 annually for each child to attend a non-public school.

- •A child must be zoned and have attended a Memphis/Shelby County School for the previous school year. (Many of our schools still take students for this school year). Please note that the municipal districts are not included (Collierville, Germantown, Millington, Bartlett, Arlington).
- •A family must financially qualify for this assistance.
- •A family must apply with the State of Tennessee to participate as well as apply for admission to the school they would like to attend.

The \$8,200 credit will cover the expenses for a child to attend an elementary/middle school for the academic year. For those in high school, St. Benedict does have financial assistance available to help close the gap between the \$8,200 and the cost of tuition. Financial assistance is available according to family need, which is issued on a first-come, first-served basis, so we encourage your families to apply early! Unfortunately, we are not able to provide assistance for all applicants, but we are committed to help as many of our families in need as we are able.

St. Benedict has also committed to providing space for new students in grades 9, 10, and 11. SBA's window of opportunity is open now through Friday, June 2, 2023. Without sounding like a QVC commercial with "operators standing by to take your calls" - St. Benedict is ready to answer questions and assist any family through the process and help them find the appropriate school for their children. Would you please consider allowing one of us to communicate with your parishioners and PRE families at Mass, and via email or mail? Any face time or contact information you can provide will help in sharing the gift of Catholic education in Memphis and West Tennessee.

Tennessee ESA PROGRAM

What is the Education Savings Account (ESA) Program?

Education Savings Accounts are administered by the Tennessee Department of Education. ESA funds provide additional school choices to families who are zoned to a Memphis/Shelby County public school and are income-eligible. Families can utilize ESA funds toward tuition, fees, books, and other educational expenses at participating private schools.
