


The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at all the Masses at St. Patrick Today.




Shrove Tuesday Palms and Ashes King Cake

RELIABLE TRANSPORTATION NEEDED!

Recently our St. Vincent de Paul conference helped a deserving neighbor with rent. She is a single mother who lives nearby in Forum Flats and is caring for her disabled, adult son. She has a good job that would normally meet their living expenses; however, she was recently involved in an accident that totaled her car. Now she must Uber to her fulltime job in Bartlett everyday, which costs at least \$200 each week. She is trying to save for another vehicle, but, as you can imagine, the monthly Uber price tag of \$800 (or more) each month is making that objective untenable.

I am reaching out to our St. Patrick's community to see if anyone knows of a reliable used car or some other transportation op-



tion that might sustain and support this family, even temporarily. (NOTE: MATA isn't feasible due to time constraints. We've looked into other community com-

muter programs, but options are very limited and largely unviable.) If you have ideas, suggestions, or recommended solutions, please email Sandy Heiss at





Procedure for Reporting Sexual Abuse

Anyone who has knowledge of or who has cause to suspect an incident of sexual abuse should report the information to the appropriate civil authorities first at 1-877-237-0004, then to the Diocesan Director of Child & Youth Protection at 901-359-2027 or the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 901-652-4066.
