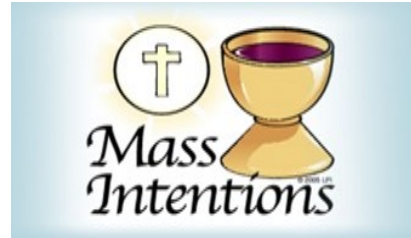

Stations of the Cross Through the Neighborhood with Father Bruce Nieli, C.S.P.! Good Friday, April 7, 10:00am Parking Lot Behind St. Patrick Church

Please join us at **10:00 on Good Friday** as we walk the Stations of the Cross at historical and everyday landmarks throughout our downtown neighborhood. We walk through the neighborhood carrying a cross, stopping at



various points of interest related to social justice, to pray and reflect. The journey begins in the St. Patrick Annex parking lot and ends inside the Church. Station locations include the Civil Rights Museum, WLOK, Clayborn Temple, Ida B. Wells Memorial, as well as other everyday sites.

Fr. Bruce Nieli, C.S.P. will lead us in reflection and in song with his guitar at each stop as we process on the journey. It's a unique tradition at St. Pat's, which provides a profound and deeply spiritual experience.



This is a family-friendly event, so load up the baby slings and the strollers.

Transportation will be available for those who would like to participate but are unable to walk the route, and water will be available as needed.

Following the Stations, join us for our Good Friday Service at 3:00pm in the church.

Father Bruce Nieli, C.S.P. is a priest of the Missionary Society of St. Paul the Apostle (Paulist). During the Year of Mercy, Father Nieli was commissioned by Pope Francis as one of the Missionaries of Mercy.

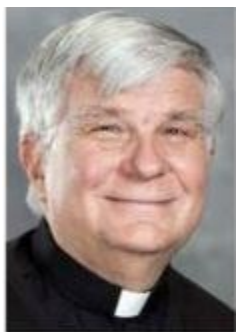

Father Bruce Nieli, CSP

Fr. Bruce is coming to St. Patrick again this year to lead us in the Stations of the Cross in our Neighborhood. He will preside at the 8:30 Easter Sunday Mass and we will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of his ordination after the 8:30 Mass in the Champion Outreach Center.

Fr. Bruce is an evangelist and missionary, based at St. Patrick Church from 1998 - 2013, and currently based in Austin, TX. As part of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, he was named a **Missionary of Mercy of Pope Francis**.

A native of Long Island, NY, Fr. Bruce was ordained in 1973. He is past director of evangelization of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Fr. Bruce leads parish missions and retreats, and speaks at a variety of diocesan and regional conferences. He is fully bilingual and does presentations in both English and Spanish. "Responding to the Spirit in the Soul, in the Church and in the World" is one of his topics, as is the spirituality of St. Paul the Apostle.

FOR LENT, FOR LIFE

What You Give Up For Lent Changes Lives

Return your Rice Bowl on Holy Thursday.

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, one of the most significant moments of the Church year. During this week, we journey with Christ from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his final meal with his closest friends and ultimately to his death on the cross.

As we walk with Jesus through Holy Week, we call to mind the countless men, women and children who even today carry heavy crosses: crosses of hunger, of homelessness, of a lack of resources or security. In these brothers and sisters we encounter Christ, as he walks that long road to Calvary. In these encounters, it's important not to forget an essential pillar of Lenten spirituality—almsgiving—which allows us to help those who are most in need.

This final week of Lent is also a time to reflect on those words of Saint Paul to the Philippians. Jesus emptied himself for us; how might we empty ourselves for others? Our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving have prepared us to wrestle with this question.

We must always remember that Holy Week gives way to Easter—the fast turns into a feast. God wins the day. As we prepare to celebrate Easter with joy, it is our responsibility as members of God's one human family to share that joy with everyone, near and far.

Fasting and Abstinence during Lent



Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.


In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

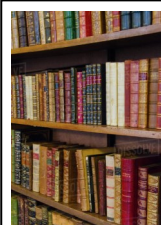

Foot and Hand Washing at our Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper

In the Gospel on Holy Thursday, we hear these words from Jesus, after he had washed the feet of his disciples:

"Do you understand what I just did for you? You address me as 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and fittingly enough, for that is what I am. But if I washed your feet – I who am Teacher and Lord – then you must wash each other's feet. What I just did was to give you an example: as I have done, so you must do." (*John 13:12-15*)

Here, at St. Patrick's, we take that responsibility seriously. As we strive to **see** Jesus in others, and **be** Jesus **for** others, we welcome this opportunity for us to be Jesus for each other in a special way, and to allow ourselves to experience Jesus's love for us.



Following our Liturgy of the Word, we will reenact the Washing of the Feet from the story of the Last Supper. You will have the opportunity to have your own feet (or hands) washed, and in turn, wash someone else's, in an active commemoration of what Jesus taught us about service to others. We have added the hand washing stations because there are some who, for whatever reason, are not able to have their feet washed, or to bend and wash another's.

We will have 6 stations altogether – 2 along each side, in the corners, for washing feet and 1 in the middle of them, along each side, for washing hands. Please come to have your hands or feet washed, then wait and wash the hands or feet of the next person. We ask that you consider letting your neighbor have the honor of washing either your feet or hands. What would it be like to have God's own Son before me to wash my feet as a symbol of what He would do to cleanse my soul?

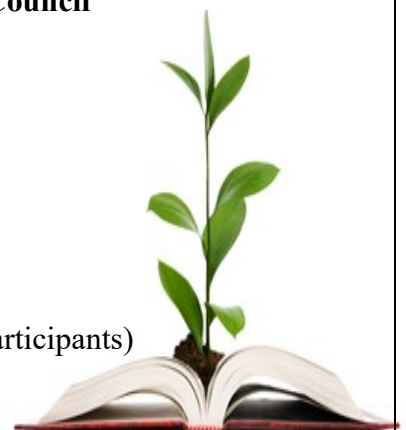
