




"The Champion Breakfast"


Back by popular demand, the long-standing Deacon Champion Sunday Breakfast will return on

The Millington Six

Dan Hawkins Graham White Edward Hall John Hayes Robert Haynes William Warner

On the evening of August 31, 1894, six men were lynched in a rural area near Millington and Kerrville in Shelby County. Their names were Dan Hawkins, Graham White, Edward Hall, John Hayes, Robert Haynes, and William Warner. The men were accused of burning barns in the area. After being rounded up, the men were shackled and chained together, and forced into a wagon to be taken to the Shelby County jail in Memphis. The deputy in charge of this arrest was a W. Richardson. The driver of the wagon was A.T. Atkins. Close to midnight, in the woods of Big Creek Bottoms, a mob of fifty men appeared and surrounded the wagon. The shackled men raised their arms to show that they were unarmed and defenseless. However, the mob used rifles and shotguns to fire at them until all were dead. Next, the bodies were placed together in what one newspaper described as a "pile" and shot again. The mob then rode off, leaving the maimed bodies at the scene.

Information from a number of people who knew those responsible for this crime led to charges of conspiracy to commit murder against Deputy Richardson, Mr. Atkins, and approximately twelve other men. Mr. Richardson's trial occurred first. Although overwhelming evidence was presented against him, he was acquitted in December, 1894. The other men were acquitted shortly afterward. The widows presented information during the trial about their deceased husbands. Graham White's wife said that he was 28 when he was murdered, and they had been married for eight years. William Warner's widow reported that her husband was an employee of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad. She had been married to Mr. Warner eleven years. The widows also described the conditions of their husbands' bodies after the lynching. John Hayes' wife of ten years said that her husband's body was brought to her house the next evening, and his eyes had been shot out. He had also been shot in the back and other places. When Ed Hall's wife received his body, the back of the head and brains had been "shot off." The men's funerals were held in Kerrville.


Apparently local white journalists were beginning to acknowledge these horrific crimes. An editorial in the Commercial Appeal written a few days later called the lynching a "Coldblooded, brutal, devilish atrocity" committed by "bloody beasts." The renowned African-American journalist Ida B. Wells, originally from Memphis, was quoted in the Indianapolis Journal as saying, "I scarcely know what to say of this butchery …this is but a sample of the sort of things done in the South. The white men down there do not think any more of killing a negro than they do of slaying a mad dog." Ms. Wells described the United States as "standing idly by and seeing one section disgrace the entire country."
