

A Note from the Pastor

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...



On August 22, the Church celebrates a memorial in honor of the Queenship of Mary. This memorial is placed an octave, that is, eight days after celebrating Mary's Assumption into Heaven. The Queenship can be considered a prolongation of the celebration of the Assumption.

Christ, the slain and risen Lamb, is "King of kings and Lord of lords." (Rv 19:16) On earth, though, He was not a king according to the categories of this world (cf. Jn 18:36): He reigned from the cross and with the power of love. Furthermore, the King, paradoxically, was the Servant of his subjects. He washed their feet (cf. Jn 13:4-5), gave His life for them (cf. 1 Jn 3:16; Eph 5:2; Jn 15:13), and wanted their relationships to be shaped by His example of love (cf. Jn 13:34-35, 15:12.17) and mutual service (cf. Jn 13:14-15; Mt 20:25-28; Mk 10:42-45; Lk 22:24-27).

Mary is Queen and Our Lady because of Christ who is King of the Universe. Vatican II, sanctioning a tradition going back to the fourth century, reaffirmed authoritatively the doctrine of Mary's regality: "When her earthly life was over," she was "exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son." (Lumen Gentium 59)


"The Champion Breakfast"








No Power but Love


Create in us a new mind and heart that will enable us to see brothers and sisters in the faces of those divided by racial categories.

The 272: The Families Who Were Enslaved and Sold to Build the American Catholic Church

Saturday, September 9 1:00 p.m.

The 272 tells the story of the Church's history of enslavement in America, while illustrating the consequences, by focusing on generations of one family that had several members among those 272 people sold by the Church in 1838.

Author Rachel L. Swarns, in an interview on NPR, said of her work: "It is certainly a story of heartbreak, yes. But it's also a story of family and faith. And it turns out that the Church itself meant a lot to these families. The Church was not in their minds, you know, controlled by these sinful men who did these things. The Church was more than that. They could not control the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit — all of that belongs to those people. And not only did they hold on to their faith, but after the [Civil] War, they became religious leaders, many lay leaders within the institution, and tried to reshape it. I see myself in the Church and these families who were so determined to hold onto their faith and to make the Church true to what it said it was — a universal church, a church that welcomed and accepted everyone. That has been really inspiring to me to see how they did that and how they worked to reshape the Church."







FROM THE DIOCESE

Dear Faithful,

As our Diocese's Strategic Pastoral Planning Summary Report is being developed, based on all the excellent feedback from our Sessions, Interviews and Survey, see the following outline of our entire process as a reminder of the communications shared in our most recent update letter sent out on August 1 (www.cdom.org).

Phase I

November 2022-April 2023

Prepare and distribute all documents associated with Listening Sessions, Individual Interviews and Online Survey to our Clergy, Strategic Pastoral Planning Committee and other Diocese leaders.

Phase II

May 2023-July 2023

Encourage involvement in our outreach efforts from all parishioners and community members across our Diocese through letters, videos and other information from our Bishop and Clergy.

The following results from our outreach efforts will be the basis in developing a Strategic Pastoral Planning Summary Report.

- -- 12 Listening Sessions (8 English and 4 Spanish) that involved more than 500 people in all four Deaneries in West Tennessee.
- -- 25 Individual Interviews with members of the Strategic Pastoral Planning Committee and other Pastoral leaders representing diverse communities in the Diocese.
- -- An Online Survey that more than 2,000 people participated in.

August 2023-September 2023

Develop a Strategic Pastoral Planning Summary Report based on what was heard in the Listening Sessions, Interviews, and Survey.

October 2023

Share the Summary Report with all parishioners across West Tennessee with an invitation to make additional comments and suggestions.

November 2023

Prepare a Vision Statement based of the Summary Report and an updated Demographics Report—led by the Bishop with the Strategic Pastoral Planning Committee.

December 2023

Publish the Diocese's Vision Statement across all 47 Parishes and Missions in West Tennessee during the Advent season.

Phase III

January 2024-December 2024

Develop detailed action plans designed to achieve our Vision Statement—led by the Strategic Pastoral Planning Committee with a few Task Teams across our Diocese's Ministries.

- -- The process will involve Committee and Task Team meetings during the first six to eight months of 2024.
- -- After consulting with our Presbyteral and Finance Councils, and other Diocesan organizations, the Committee will recommend a three-to-five-year Strategic Pastoral Plan to the Bishop for final approval and implementation in January 2025.

Phase IV

January 2025

Implement our Strategic Pastoral Plan

Our Diocese trust that the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) are accompanying us—to teach, guide, and empower us to build a future full of hope for all the people of West Tennessee. Please continue to pray for the success of this important Strategic Pastoral Planning process.
