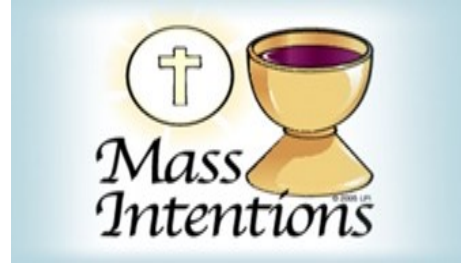

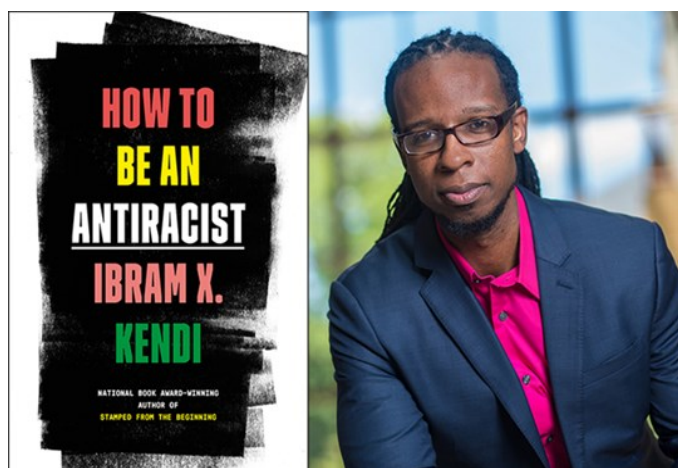

Recently volunteers packed up the books in the library and moved them and the shelving to the lobby annex.

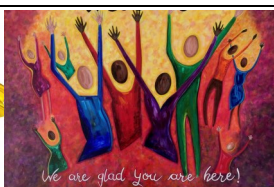

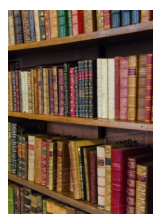

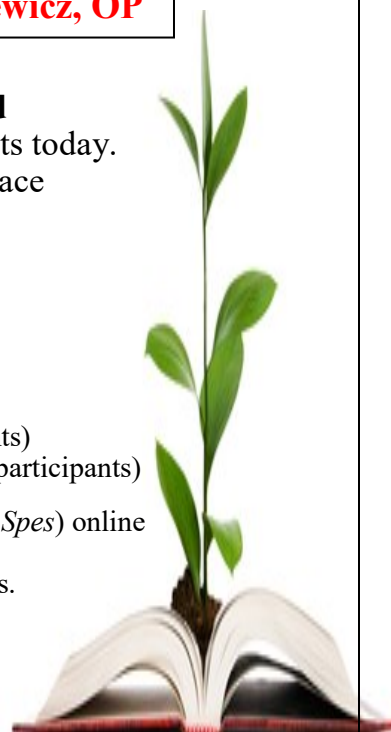
