A Note from the Pastor

WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT THANKSGIVING DAY?



As an immigrant for 16 years in this great country, one of the celebrations I look forward is Thanksgiving Day. Back home in the Philippines where I come from, we celebrate our Thanksgiving Day during the feast day of the patron saint of the town. Say for example, the feast day of the patron saint, St. Catherine of Alexandria, of the city where I come from, Dumaguete City, is November 25. The whole city celebrates her feast day as our way of Thanksgiving Day and people invite the neighboring cities or towns or their relatives to cele-

brate with them. This is the day also when friends, relatives, and family members who are out of town will come home and get together as one family. So, Thanksgiving Day back home varies according to the feast day of the patron saint of the city or town.

Here, it's not just a town or a city or a county or a state. It's the whole nation with one heart and one voice who give thanks to the Almighty God for the many blessings each received. Just like on the "First Thanksgiving Day that was celebrated by the Pilgrims of Plymouth Colony in the early 1600's. Although they were accustomed to thanksgiving celebrations (days of prayer), the specific purpose of the First Thanksgiving Day was to thank God for helping them survive their first New England winter. However, the first time Thanksgiving Day was celebrated as a national holiday was about 240 years later when President Abraham Lincoln gave it official recognition in 1863. During his proclamation address Lincoln said, 'It has seemed to me fit and proper that the gracious gifts of the Most High God should be solemnly, reverently, and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice, by the whole American people. I do therefore invite my fellow-citizens . . . to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a day of thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens.' So, what is special about Thanksgiving Day? Is it the poor turkey and bunch of tasty dishes on the dinner table that makes it special? In a way, yeah (Yummy!). Is it the night of Thanksgiving Day and the following day called- Black Friday when prices of the electronics to dresses and shoes to house decorations, etc. really go down that makes it special? In a way, yeaaahh! Who would not buy big discounted stuff. Is it the live football games on TV? For some, yeah. For some, who cares! But what really makes the Thanksgiving Day special? For me, it's not the poor turkey and bunch of tasty dishes on the table (though they're part of it) or the big discounted stuff or the football games. For me, it's the home coming of the family members who have been a way for months from college or who have been a way for years because of the job. For me, it's the gathering of friends and relatives. For me, it's the words for each other, "I miss you," or "I am sorry," or "I have forgiven you," or, "I'm so happy you are home," or "I love you." For me, what makes it special is FAMILY. And what makes Thanksgiving Day more special is that as one FAMILY with every families in this great nation, we say together, 'Thank you God for everything.'

To each and everyone of you, HAPPY THANKSGIVING! To each family, HAPPY THANKSGIVING! To all my St. Patrick parishioners, HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

As one family of St. Patrick, let's say together, "Thank you God for everything, for our faith, and for our community." After all, God deserves our Thank you.
