


WHAT DO CATHOLICS REALLY BELIEVE?

Thanksgiving Message

As Catholics we celebrate Thanksgiving (the translation of the word "Eucharist") every time we come to Mass. We are called to be the Eucharist in the world every day. We thank God for what we have been given and we thank each other for the community we find in Communion not only when we gather on Sundays, but every day and through the highs and lows of our lives. Before we receive the Eucharist, we are called to examine our consciences and ask forgiveness for when we have failed to be the hands and feet of God here on Earth.

While many of us celebrated the national holiday of Thanksgiving last Thursday, others, particularly our Native American siblings, held space for the National Day of Mourning to "honor Indigenous ancestors and Native resilience." This tradition, started in 1970 by the Native peoples of what is now called New England, is a day of "remembrance and spiritual connection, as well as a protest against the racism and oppression that Indigenous people continue to experience worldwide."

As Catholics, we are called beyond our thanksgiving to work for justice and live in solidarity as a global family. Though the national holiday of Thanksgiving celebrates the (Protestant) "pilgrims" colonization of Massachusetts and the myth of peace between the English settlers and the Wampanoag people, the Catholic Church (that means us) cannot extricate itself from the harm and genocide that we perpetrated against the people of what is now the United States. Luckily, Catholic tradition and sacraments lend to this work as we examine our consciences and repair the harm we have caused through penitential efforts.

Pope Francis writes in *Fratelli Tutti,* "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community. It means that the lives of all are prior to the appropriation of goods by a few. It also means combatting the structural causes of poverty, inequality, the lack of work, land and housing, the denial of social and labor rights. It means confronting the destructive effects of the empire of money..."

Just like prayer is not only the words on our lips, but also the work of our bodies, thanksgiving is a movement to be worthy of the abundant mercy of God. Can we truly give thanks to God if we are not thinking of all who are in need and are pushed to the margins? We heard last Tuesday, in the psalm for the Memorial of the Presentation of Mary, Mother Mary's celebration of God's promises to cast down the mighty and lift the lowly, to fill the hungry with good things and send the rich away empty. In this culture of over-consumption and over-stimulation, this present era of collective amnesia when it comes to the harm we have done and continue to do, can we take time to not only remember to give thanks to God that we have what we need but also to remember those who don't because of our man-made systems. And, most importantly, to show our thanks to God by sharing our own abundance.

St Patrick Champion Community Outreach Center

Dear St Patrick Parishioners,

On behalf of the <u>St Patrick Champion</u> Outreach Center, Father Dexter and especially the hundreds of guests each month the center serves---Thank you!

Thanks to those of you who volunteer, thanks for your financial support and for your prayers.

The Center is bouncing back from near complete closure during covid to now a very busy place.

There are no paid employees in the center - just volunteers.

Let me update you on what you have done in the center:

- 1. Each Sunday, 50 75 hungry guests enjoy a hot, sit-down meal (turkey and all the fix ins).
- 2. Your food pantry provides a week's worth of food for those in need 3 days per week, and the number of those needing help is steadily increasing. In October, 303 families which equates to 753 family members received food of this number 40% were children and 25% seniors.
- 3. Lunch bags with homemade sandwiches for those in need are available 3 days a week.
- 4. With your help and that of the Radians company, who provided over 1,000 coats and 2,800 pairs of gloves, Embers of Hope distributed these items at our recent giveaway and shared many with Manna House and the Veteran's Association.
- 5. New or lightly used clothing is now distributed. So, if you have things in your closet that you no longer use, or don't fit or maybe clothing from a loved one, contact Melissa or me.
- 6. A 4th Sunday 9:30 "Breakfast of Champion" for the parish.
- 7. A monthly mobile pantry with the help of Midsouth Food Bank and the Rotary Club where 400 cars are served.
- 8. This past Monday over 112 families received a thanksgiving basket and a turkey.
- 9. We plan for another 100 baskets for Christmas.
- 10.It is our hope to soon restore the screening medical clinic and provide a warming center for women this winter.
