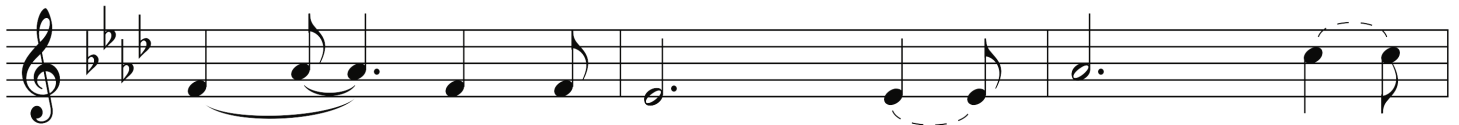
## Profession of Faith:
