This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of the holy season of Lent. A simple reminder that as Catholics: on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent— everyone of age 14 and up must abstain form consuming meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday: Everyone of age 18 to 59 must fast, unless exempt due to usually a medical reason. Fasting means consuming on one full meal a day— two smaller meals that don't together add up to a full meal. Let us make this season of Lent a holy journey for us.

My name is Rosalyn Bridges, and I am a Doctoral Student at The University of Southern California; however, I live in Memphis. I have a project that addresses a global social problem that would be perfect for us to take on and help solve, beginning right here at St. Patrick's. This unique program will focus on early prevention training for a topic that is **LEMOM** difficult for us moms to talk about: Child Sexual Abuse.

We will learn valuable skills to engage in open, ageappropriate conversations, increasing their safety even when we're not by their sides. We will explore practical ways to initiate everyday conversations with our children, where they feel comfortable sharing their thoughts and experiences. The goal is to empower us with the tools to

navigate these crucial discussions. Together, we can create an inviting, non-judgmental, supportive network where every mother feels confident in her ability to protect her child from potential harm.

I am very excited about collaborating with 6-8 single

ST. PATRICK PARISH CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY

Living: Terry Steib (b.1940)

Bishop Emeritus Terry Steib was born in Vacherie, Louisiana, to Rosemond and Vivian (née Jones) Steib. From priest to dean to professor, Bishop Steib has long been involved in education and equality. He earned a Master of Arts degree in Guidance and Counseling from Xavier University of Louisiana in 1973 and continued to use his learned skills throughout his entire career. In 1993, Terry Steib was installed as the fourth Bishop of Memphis. At this time he became the first African American bishop of the Diocese of Memphis. One of his most important accomplishments during his tenure was "the reclaiming of the Catholic schools to create one Catholic school system". Known as the "Jubilee" schools, they included eight Memphis Catholic schools that were closed and reopened. "When we closed a school in an urban area, we were leaving more than buildings behind; we were leaving behind children who yearned for a Catholic school more than ever", says Steib. Adding that "it is the heritage of Catholic education to lift up those most in need". Additionally, he helped to pioneer the dioceasan ministry for Catholic gay and lesbian persons. In his pastoral letter from June of 2005, "This Far by Faith", Bishop Steib wrote: "To be sure that we

do not leave anyone behind...to be sure that we promote genuine gratitude and reverence for the gift that each one of us is to the Church". Reflecting on his experiences as an African American Bishop, he says, "An important challenge is to get our people in the Church to see the universality of church in all its cultural diversity, to look at and bless these differences and to see the beauty of one church and one family."

Deceased: Sr Thea Bowman (1937-1990)

Born Dec. 29, 1937, in Yazoo City, Mississippi, Thea was reared as a Protestant until at age nine when she asked her parents if she could become a Catholic. Gifted with a brilliant mind, beautiful voice and a dynamic personality, Sister Thea shared the message of God's love through a teaching career. After 16 years of teaching, at the elementary, secondary and university level, the bishop of Jackson, Mississippi, invited her to become the consultant for intercultural awareness. In her role as consultant Sister Thea, an African American, gave presentations across the country; lively gatherings that combined singing, gospel preaching, prayer and storytelling. Her programs were directed to break down racial and cultural barriers. She encouraged people to communicate with one another so that they could understand other cultures and races. In 1984, Sr. Thea was diagnosed with breast cancer. She prayed "to live until I die." Her prayer was answered, and Thea continued her gatherings seated in a wheelchair. In 1989, the U.S. bishops invited her to be a key speaker at their conference on



Black Catholics. At the end of the meeting, at Thea's invitation, the bishops stood and sang "We Shall Overcome" with gusto. Throughout her life, she led many revival and praise services around the country, including at our own, St Patrick church. Thea lived a full life. She fought evil, especially prejudice, suspicion, hatred and things that drive people apart. She fought for God and God's people until her death in 1990. Sr. Thea now resides at Elmwood cemetery in Memphis, TN!
