





Spotlight On Anna Champion

In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued a presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8, 1980, as National Women's History Week. The proclamation stated,

"From the first settlers who came to our shores, from the first American Indian families who befriended them, men and women have worked together to build this nation. Too often the women were unsung and sometimes their contributions went unnoticed. But the achievements, leadership, courage, strength and love of the women who built America



was as vital as that of the men whose names we know so well. As Dr. Gerda Lerner has noted, 'Women's History is Women's Right.' It is an essential and indispensable heritage from which we can draw pride, comfort, courage, and long-range vision. I ask my fellow Americans to recognize this heritage with appropriate activities during National Women's History Week, March 2–8, 1980. I urge libraries, schools, and community organizations to focus their observances on the leaders who struggled for equality –Susan B. Anthony, Sojourner Truth, Lucy Stone, Lucretia Mott, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Harriet Tubman,

and Alice Paul. Understanding the true history of our country will help us to comprehend the need for full equality under the law for all our people. This goal can be achieved by ratifying the 27th Amendment to the United States Constitution, which states that 'Equality of Rights under the Law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.'" In 1987, after being petitioned by the National Women's History Project, Congress designated the month of March as Women's History Month.

What would we have gained, if the savior of the world had not been birthed from our Holy Mother's womb? Would we be here if they didn't believe the women at the empty tomb? Often, the Church is referred to with feminine pronouns as she is our home and our comfort. Yes, St Patrick, the Holy Spirit and her flame are present in all of us and for a long time, women have been the backbone of our church community, from Eddie Mae Hawkins to Julie Boland to Tracy Burgess and more. Always, but especially this month, we must uplift and highlight women within our St Patrick's Community that have truly kept us together.

If you come to the 8:30 Mass, you'll hear a rich, angelic, singing voice in the front row. This voice belongs to a mother of our church, Anna Champion. An essential pilar of our home, Anna spent years helping to run the outreach center. A journalist, Mrs. Champion has been lending us her gift of words for years including writing a quarterly journal for our church. This month, we'll be graced once more with her talent as she reflects on women in our community. What is truly special about Anna is how special she can make us feel. Anna's ability to highlight our community's strengths uplifts us as a mother uplifts their child. She knows us and we are honored to get to love her. Thank you Anna, for all that you've helped build in us, young and old, new and accustomed, our family has been and forever will be imprinted with your care.

A STORY OF HOPE FROM UGANDA







Adolf and his wife, Florence, are farmers in Akwangagwel, Uganda. The couple is dedicated to fighting hunger so that their family and others in their community can build thriving lives. They do this by farming, which helps their family to eat three nutritious meals a day, and by assisting others in their community to grow successful crops. Each member of their household has an important role, like gardening, cleaning, preparing meals and caring for the animals. In the evenings, they enjoy spending time together as a family. Adolf is thankful for the free time to sit and relax with his children.

In the area where they live, the climate is very dry. Lately, the rainy season has been coming later than it used to. And sometimes, it rains too much all at once and causes flooding.

"It rains so heavily and destroys things," Adolf says. "So, the goodness of rain is taken away."

In addition, people come through their community and steal their food or tools. It makes it difficult to farm with these challenges—and that means food is harder to come by.

To overcome these obstacles, Adolf and Florence joined a Catholic Relief Services program where they learned new farming methods that help them grow crops even when it is hot and dry. They planted seeds that grow quickly, so that they can still have vegetables to harvest, even if there isn't much rain. This provides enough food to eat and to sell at the market for extra income.

"I have seen my children are happy because they are well fed," Adolf says.

Because of the successful life that he and Florence have built, they are sharing the knowledge they learned with their neighbors. As a leader in his community, Adolf works with others to increase their harvests, improve the land and build a safe and thriving community.



Health and Foot Clinic

The February 25th Clinics were a resounding success. 15 people came for blood pressure and blood sugar checks. There were some troubling values and those patients were referred to the Memphis Health clinic. 26 people came to the foot clinic and most were found to have worn out or poorly fitting shoes. They were given new socks and shoes. Many thanks to the Philippine Nurse Association and many volunteers led by Beth Trouy.

The next Health and Foot clinic will be March 24th in the St Patrick Champion Outreach Center.
