

Spotlight On Judy Bettice: Called to Service



"Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and He will establish your plans. (Prov 16:3). Judy was called to teach. In teaching she was able to reach out and share what she had been given. From her years at Notre Dame, where she attended graduate school (one of seven women on campus of 7,000 men), to her three years of obtaining a Masters Degree in Pastoral Ministries from Loyola University in New Orleans, Judy knew and accepted her call. One only has to listen as she talks of her time in the classroom to know it was not simply a "job" but a gift of love she gave to each student and to all she touched for nine years in the Religion Department and Campus Ministry at Memphis Catholic High and fifteen years at Sheffield High School in the Memphis City School system. Although her children were enrolled at St. Michael's school and it was closer to her home, the Holy Spirit guided Judy to St. Patrick. It was here that she

became involved in the many programs the church sponsored for children. She taught in the Catch-Up Program which enabled students who were over age in the grade they were in to spend the summer "catching up" to the grade they should be in. This was done with strict supervision and work by the teachers, the students and parents. It was an excellent opportunity to give a sense of achievement to the students and to help them remain in school and graduate. But the need to reach out encompassed not just the school but the desire to share the gifts of knowledge of the scriptures and the church.

Judy brought a hybrid form of a city-wide study group called "SpiritWise" to St. Patrick. SpiritWise focused on women in the Bible, both old and new testaments and women leaders and saints in the Catholic Church. It was an opportunity to learn more about the church, scriptures, and the role of women. SpiritWise also served as a training tool to reach out to women in the parish to assume leadership roles. The women in the church would sign up the first of each year to be responsible for a month. The presenter would prepare, in varying formats and style, a presentation of the women from scripture or the saint to be discussed. It was learning, reaching out, and growing women for the future.

Retreats were also an important part of hearing and honoring God's call to service. For years, Judy helped organize the Women's Retreats. The retreats were held in state parks over a weekend (the last one was held in 2006). The retreats were a time of prayer, reflection, sharing, relaxing, and listening. Retreat leaders were a mixture of women from the city's religious communities, regardless of denomination. The only requirement of the retreat leader was a love of God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit and her desire to share her faith experience. In 1998, Judy gathered a committee together to establish the first Mary Magdala celebration which is still held each year in the Outreach Center. Open to everyone, it is a time to give honor to "The Apostles Apostle." There are speakers, prayer, music, and a lunch to follow.

Judy is truly following the plan God has laid out for her. She is active in the Ministry to the Sick, is a Lector, has worked in the program with refugees, and keeps everyone aware of the needs of those in other countries. She does this through our Lenten giving, working faithfully with the Mid South Peace and Justice Center, and being a member of Pax Christi International. In her free time, she loves, cares, and nurtures her children. Catherine (Cat), Margie, Susan, and Michael. She is also a grandmother to four grandchildren and a godmother to three children (Odile, Kevin, and Caroline). Mary Ruben, the deceased mother of Judy's godchildren, was a refugee from Sudan, and a blessing to our church and to anyone who had the great pleasure of getting to know her.

Proverbs 11:25 says, "Generous persons will proposer: those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed". For decades, Judy has been and continues to refresh this grateful St. Patrick's community. May she be refreshed by our love, gratitude, and prayerful thanksgiving for her generous gifts in learning, training, and reaching out to the community. She has truly blessed us with her unending commitment to service.

A STORY OF HOPE FROM INDONESIA







Located in Southeast Asia between the Pacific and Indian Oceans, Indonesia has beautiful beaches, diverse cultures and nearly 280 million people—the fourth highest population in the world!

Many of the country's more than 17,000 islands are in the Ring of Fire, a region around the rim of the Pacific Ocean where volcanic eruptions and earthquakes are common. Climate-related disasters such as cyclones also threaten the islands and are becoming more frequent and destructive.



Strong rains and wind from these storms—combined with long periods without rain, called drought—make it difficult for people like Evita Tiro Wada to grow food. Evita and her family live on Flores Island, where she keeps a home garden for food and income. To help her family and community become more resilient against natural disasters and have more reliable access to food, Evita participated in a Catholic Relief Services'

program, through which she joined a disaster preparedness group.

The group helps their community stay safe during emergencies like cyclones and earthquakes. They created a system to warn people to evacuate and identified evacuation routes, assembly points and resources they can use during a crisis.

The group also maintains a community garden. They grow vegetables like beans, eggplant and water spinach to provide healthy food for their families. They use a drip irrigation system that conserves water so the vegetables can grow even during a drought. Evita and her group members use the garden to teach people from other communities how to start their own.



To protect their garden from the wind and prevent erosion from the ocean waves, Evita and her group planted trees. They also cleaned up the river and other areas in their town by picking up trash, which helped prevent flooding.

Evita says, "When I first joined the village disaster preparedness group, I thought, 'What will I do or give to help the community?' After I've been involved, I see the benefits of what the community and I did."
