

Real Presence

Have you ever kissed a child's finger and watched the tears disappear? Sat silently with someone who recently got a serious diagnosis? Taken



flowers from your yard or a fragrant loaf of cinnamon bread to an elderly shut-in? Called or sent a text to check on someone who usually sits near you at Mass but has been absent for two weeks?

One of my favorite stories from Luke's Gospel is about Jesus healing a paralyzed man. His friends believed that Jesus had the power to heal, so they brought their friend to the house where Jesus was. They tried to carry the man into the house, but it was so crowded that they took him up on the roof, opened the tiles, and lowered him on his bed into the middle of the group. Jesus, the love of God made visible, has power to heal and to forgive.

Henry Nouwen said, "Caring is the privilege of every person and is at the heart of being human." I have treasured the years I've been able to bring the Eucharist and pray with those who might be facing upheaval or distress in their life, either as a temporary setback or as a permanent condition. I know that wherever two or three are gathered, Jesus---in the power of the Spirit—is right there in the middle of things. Sometimes when we hit a rough patch on our journey, it's hard to pray. We feel stymied by our circumstances, almost paralyzed. That's when we wish we could be among the caring people we know. Ministers to the Sick bring the Real Presence and the whole community to those who are not able join in the Sunday Assembly. Friends can carry us to the Source of healing and help us face the obstacles. Real Presence is being there for another, standing by them, reminding them that God's love unites us all.

Spotlight On Sandy Heiss: "Here I Am, Lord"



We are all called to service. We are also given the wonderful God given gift of "free will. "It is our decision to determine and decide which path in life we wish to pursue. Sandra Heiss, Sandy as we all know and love her, made a decision 40 years ago to enter the doors of St. Patrick Catholic Church. Raised a Methodist, Sandy rented a house from Le Martin, a member of St Patrick's. Le invited Sandy to come visit her church. Sandy accepted the invitation and never looked back.

She felt St. Patrick's was a true community of God's people who believed in living His word, not just on Sunday, but every day of the week. The welcome she received from people she did not know was warm and spirit-filled. There was so much Sandy loved about her initial experience. She loved not just the warmth, but the diversity of people, cultures, races, economics. This was how life was to be, all God's children together loving and accepting each other. Sandy flourished in her new church life and after being a faithful member of

St. Patrick's for seven years she attended RCIA classes and was later confirmed.

Her call to further service was just beginning. She worked for ten years with the Mid-South Blood Bank as a Public Information Manager and ten years in Marketing and Communications for a large Customer Relationship management firm. She obtained her certification as a Project Manager and became a contractor with FEMA. In this position she worked in areas devastated by disaster. She worked in areas of devastation caused by Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Irma, Ian, Nicole, and Sandy and a major flood in Louisiana.

But it was not simply helping with paperwork for these area governments and non-profit organizations, it was as she states, "trying to make the communities whole again." It was the utter destruction and despair which "broke my heart" and called her to reach out to help not only with the paperwork, but offer the compassion that so many needed. How-ever, in doing her work and helping the people in need of her services, she states the one thing she missed most (after her children) was her church community of St. Patrick's. Sandy now states she can work remotely, if needed from home, but is semi-retired.

At home in the church she loves, Sandy in the past served on the Pastoral Council. She also currently serves as a Council member. She has worked with the church's Youth Groups, has been and continues to be a member of the choir, is a Cantor, and has served periodically in the past as the liturgical music coordinator for the church. She is a member of BAM and "A Prayer Circle" which meets Monday - Friday at 9:00 a.m. She also helped in the past with the Women's Retreats assisting in planning and coordination. She still heard the call to do more and gladly said, "Here I Am." The call to reach out to others to tell the Good News was for her to write a musical play. Yes, a musical play! One of the songs she wrote is called "Mary's Song" and is sung by her each Christmas. Most of us will know it as "Beautiful Baby." The words of the chorus are: "You were born to save this world/ Save this world from damnation/ I have given life to you/ You will give life through salvation." Powerful lyrics by a parishioner who said, "Yes, Lord."

Sandy has also been blessed with two wonderful children, Shannon and Sean. She is also a grandmother of a beautiful, talented granddaughter who takes after her grandmother and loves to sing.

THE FRUIT OF OUR LENTEN SACRIFICE





Christ, the bread of life, fed the multitudes while on earth and today continues to nourish us spiritually through the Eucharist. This Lent, we reflected on how the Eucharist unites us with God and one another as members of the same body of Christ, and how the Lord invites us to see him in our global family.



We saw Christ in Uganda, through Adolf and Florence, who learned new farming methods, so they can provide food for their family and help their neighbors grow better crops. We can imagine how much Jesus rejoiced when Adolf said, "I have seen my children happy because they are well fed."

We saw Christ in El Salvador, in Sandra and Santos Amaya's family. Like the body of Christ—which, though one body, has many members—each family member contrib-

utes their unique gifts to support the household. We saw Christ in Sandra's sacrifices to ensure her family and community can thrive, from learning how to keep chickens to traveling long distances for training that helps her and her neighbors.



We saw Christ in Indonesia, through Evita and her disaster preparedness group. Together, they have helped keep their community safe during natural disasters, which have increased and become more destructive due to climate change. We saw Christ again in the group's communal vegetable garden, which ensures their families have nutritious food even in emergencies.

Lastly, we have seen Christ in you during this holy season—in your prayers, sacrifices and almsgiving. As we near Holy Week, we reflect on the Eucharist as the sacra-

ment of unity that ignites in us the desire to get out of our comfort zone and become Jesus' hands to care for our neighbors. Let us continue to imitate Christ in how he offers himself for us on the Cross and in the Eucharist. In this way, may we generously give of ourselves to honor and uphold the dignity of our sisters and brothers around the world.
