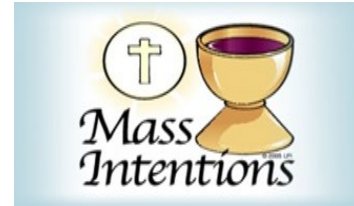

Spotlight On THE WOMEN OF ST. PATRICK'S: Steps Ordered in Christ

Today is the last day of Women's Month and also the joyous day of Christ's Resurrection. During this month, women were highlighted who give of themselves, their time, talent, and treasure to St. Patrick's Church. 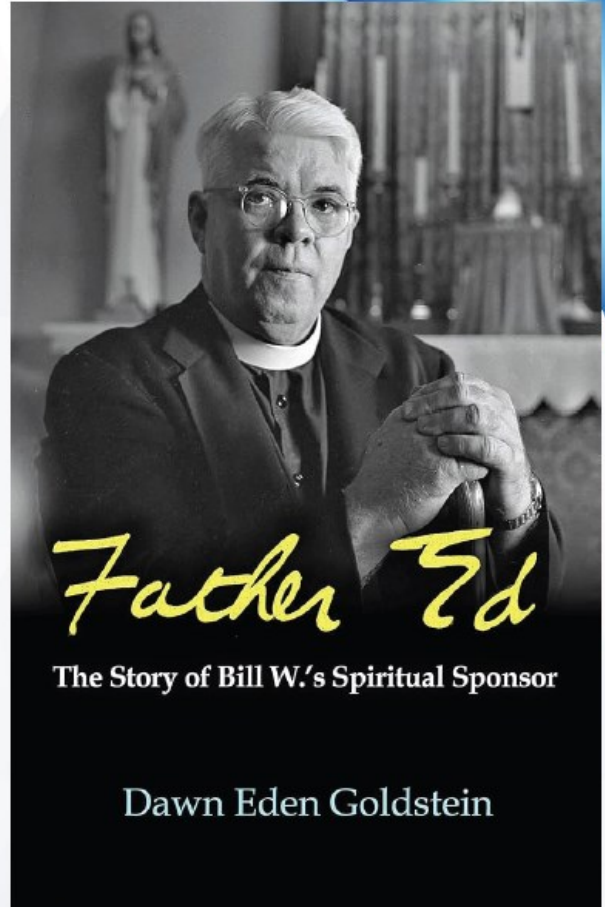
