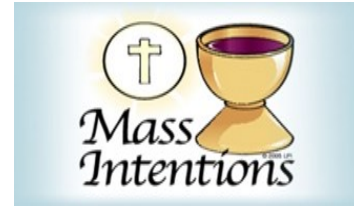

Journey to Catholicism

Part 2

In last week's bulletin, we explained why we are calling the faith journey of those who want to become Catholic "Journey to Catholicism" instead of RCIA or OCIA, which are the initials of the ritual books (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults which becomes Order of Christian Initiation of adults November 1, 2024).

The Journey to Catholicism has several stages. We begin with what we refer to as "Inquiry." During this time – from September 8 to November 24 – we will discuss questions that participants have about Catholicism and what we believe, how we worship and the sacraments of the church. This will allow the people who have never been baptized or who have been baptized in another Christian community to decide if becoming a Roman Catholic Christian is what God is calling them to and whether they want to continue the journey to becoming Catholic.

We also welcome people who were baptized in the Roman Catholic church and for some reason didn't grow up in the church or were never confirmed to join this journey to complete their full initiation by receiving the sacrament of confirmation.

During the Inquiry stage, parishioners who grew up Catholic, have received baptism, confirmation and eucharist, but have forgotten what they learned as children are welcome to join us, since we will be talking about the basics of our faith.

At the end of the inquiry stage, those who have never been baptized or were baptized in another Christian community will be formally welcomed by the St. Patrick community to continue their journey to becoming Catholic.

The Journey to Catholicism continues through Lent and those who have never been baptized receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and communion at the Easter Vigil (the Saturday night before Easter). Those baptized in another Christian community receive the sacraments of confirmation and communion.

As noted above, our Journey to Catholicism sessions will begin Sunday, September 8, 2024. We will meet in the St. Brigid Room in the Rectory from 9:45am to 10:45am on Sunday mornings.

Catechetical Sunday ***Sunday, September 15***

This offers us a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel, and is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

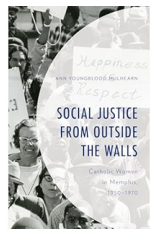

Fall Fest Memphis, in its 7th year, is evolving to positively impact the Memphis and surrounding communities by partnering with Room In The Inn Memphis. This partnership will help as the organization continue its mission in helping the city's some 6,000 homeless through congregational shelters, recuperative care, and transitioning into permanent housing.

The festival, a community-wide event, will be held at our generous host site St. Brigid Catholic Church, 7801 Lowrance Rd., Memphis, Tenn., near the FedEx World Headquarters and Southwind. The fundraiser event will be held on **Friday, Oct. 18 and Saturday, Oct. 19, 2024**, but will also include some online and off-site events throughout the week.

Fall Fest Memphis will kick-off **Saturday, Oct. 12** with a [Golf Tournament](#), hosted at Lakeland Golf and Paddle Club (formerly Stonebridge Golf Club), 3049 Davies Plantation Rd., and an [Online Auction](#) featuring amazing items up for bid through **Sunday, Oct. 20**. The remainder of the events will be held at St. Brigid Catholic Church and will include a [\\$10,000 Cash Raffle](#), [Carnival Rides and Attractions](#), [Car Show](#), [BBQ Cooking Contest](#), [Vendor Fair](#), Two-Day [Music Festival](#) with top local bands, [Food Truck Fair](#), [Cabana Space Rental](#) and a ticketed national [concert](#) titled "Live on the Field," with headliner 38 Special, with opening act The Shotgun Billys.

Admission is \$5 per person with a maximum single-family fee of \$20. Parking is free off-site with free shuttle transportation. On-site parking is available for \$20.

AROUND MEMPHIS

Save MATA from the Death Spiral!

Public transit isn't just a service—it's the heartbeat of our city, a lifeline that keeps Memphis thriving! With nearly 200,000 riders depending on it every month, a fully-funded public transit system isn't just necessary—it's non-negotiable!

But right now, our transit system is under threat. Over time, the City has reduced funds for MATA, and now, the consequences are dire. **The newly approved budget will force MATA to slash seven crucial service routes, lay off over 200 dedicated employees, and add to the toll of the 18 trolley operators already laid off last week.** The fallout from these cuts will ripple across our city, devastating riders, bus operators, mechanics, and the entire Memphis community.

We cannot stand by and watch this happen. MICAH, the Sierra Club Chickasaw Group, ATU Local 713, and the Better Transit for a Better Memphis Coalition are raising their voices, demanding immediate action. Mayor Paul Young and the Memphis City Council must step up—allocate the necessary funds now, and commit to fully funding the public transit system we all deserve. If we don't act, MATA will spiral into a devastating death spiral of service cuts, declining ridership, lost revenue, and ultimately, its demise.

We must fight to stop these service cuts, save jobs, and rescue our public transit!

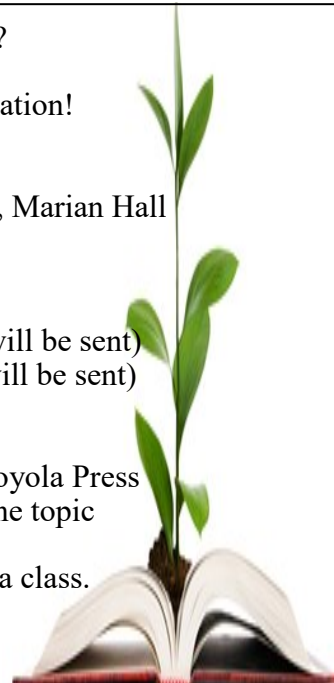
