

A Reflection From

Tears rolled down on my eyes as I rolled away from my son's school Thursday morning. There was an odd tension in the dropoff line as administrators directed traffic and students got out of cards to head into school.

"I love you mom!' my son shouted as he jumped out of the car.

"I love you so much! Have a great day!" I said as my voice cracked.

At that moment I realized that 4 families were grieving this morning because they weren't dropping off their kids or loved ones. They were killed in yet another school shooting in Georgia. The suspect in custody was a 14-year-old student accused of killing two students and two teachers with an AR-style rifle. Nine more people were injured. Hundreds will experience trauma when they think back on the horrific day.

This is a headline and moment that we are used to in the United States. And every time it happens, we hear about the thoughts and prayers. We hear about the "evil acts" of the shooter. But we never hear about working to solve the problem, address the root cause, making actual change.

To be honest with you, I am angry. Very angry. There is absolutely no reason why sending any child to school should be dangerous. There is no reason why a 14 year old should have access to a gun, let alone an AR-style rifle!

Yes, I'm talking about gun laws. Yep! I'm going there. Because this isn't a time to go silent or worry about how speaking up might impact me personally. As a Catholic and a Christian, I am called to use my conscience to discern the best way to vote. And my conscience is asking a lot of questions about gun violence and gun policies as we head into the election.

How can we be pro-life and continue to allow policies that are literally killing our children?

How can we call for justice and not work to solve the root causes of the trauma that causes people to use guns to kill innocent people?

How do we continue to live our normal everyday lives while becoming almost immune to the tragic events in our schools and in our community?

Where does our faith play a role in how we solve this problem?

How much longer can we stand back and watch before we are complicit?

Gun violence plagues our nation and our community (Memphis and many in our parish experience this firsthand). We are so accustomed to the idea of being present to it, that we are unphased by active shooting drills, numb to news of another shooting death and sometimes even oblivious to violence around us, because it's become so "normal."

As Catholics, we are called to respond in moments like these. And we are called to act with justice. We are called to speak up. We are called to be a part of the change.

And yet, change feels so hopeless. Because if those who write the laws actually wanted change, they would have used their power to write laws that help make change.

I believe that we can be AND people not OR people.

We can support the 2nd amendment and support common sense gun laws. We can support your right to protect yourself lawfully and ask for red flag laws that give police authority to help. We can believe in the right to bear arms and ask that it be regulated with permits or background checks.

After all, we can't get behind the wheel without first taking a driving test. And then getting a license, followed by insurance, registration and regular renewals.

As we head into the prime of election season, I will be taking a deep look at who's protecting our children from gun violence and who's continuing to support policies that don't.

And I will continue to pray. That can't stop. This week I will especially lift up the victims of Wednesday's school shooting. And I hope you'll do more than pray. I hope you'll take action!
